Brother Knights and family members,

I hope you and your families had a pleasant Christmas and that you are looking forward to a New Year filled with blessings and good health. As we enter into the month of February we can look back at a January filled with activities. Our most significant event was our participation in the **March for Life** on January 23rd with a very large number of collectors, including students from Paul VI High School, and **successful collection of over \$22,000** to help Ms. Nellie Gray continue her long and arduous fight to overturn Roe v. Wade. Our Quarterly Communion Mass was held on January 22nd. The Council's Annual Degree Week was held with exemplifications of the First, Second and Third Degrees with participation by a number of other area Councils.

If a deaf person has to go to court, is it still called a hearing?


Why does Superman stop bullets with his chest, but ducks when you throw a revolver at him?
