Extracurricular Activities: aspiring actress, assistant stage manager, costumes manager, Junior CYO Basketball and an active member of the High School Garden Club.

Special Achievements or Awards/Recognitions Received: Best Actress award at the 2014 Catholic Diocesan One Act Play Festival for her role in Aesop's (Oh So Slightly) Updated Fables.
