#### **Grand Knight's Message**

We are now well into Lent this year. I hope that this special period of prayer, fasting and almsgiving will bring you closer to our dear Lord.

Let me just mention a few recent activities and point out somethings coming down the pike. Since last fall, St. Leo's parish has instituted Parish Sunday

events to be held every two months. These are opportunities for parishioners, especially new ones to get better acquainted with the priests and deacons and also various ministry groups within the parish. On Super Bowl Sunday, our parish had a Parish Sunday on a grander scale, calling it Super Sunday Signup. Thanks to the efforts of Membership Chair Pat Murray, we were very well represented. This year we were fortunate enough to have Bishop Emeritus Paul Loverde come and give all of the talks at our Annual Men's Retreat. (Again, see separate article.) A big thank you to everyone who came out. This year our Council is coordinating the Lenten soup suppers held every Friday, except for Good Friday, during Lent. Thus far these are working great. We are getting a wonderful opportunity to serve the parish and also network a little bit with other parish groups. We could always use a little bit of help: between 4:30 and 5:00 for the set-up or between 6:00 and 7:30 for the soup supper itself and clean up. And most importantly, don't forget **March 22** is our Friday to provide soup. Let's knock it out of the park when it is our turn. For many years, we have been praying the Rosary to End Abortion every second Saturday of the month from 8 – 9 AM. We have said all 20 decades of the Rosary. Unfortunately, attendance for this important event has fallen off quite a bit in recent years. This trend has persisted and not just been a one-time event. For this reason, we have decided to begin the Rosary at 8:30 AM, still on the second Saturday of the month, and just recite one set of Mysteries (five decades). In this way, hopefully more Knights will participate, it will be less rushed, and we will have plenty of time to attend the 9 AM Mass.

On a final note, this morning at the State Meeting I heard a Gospel verse that struck me. "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven" (Matt 5:16). As individuals and collectively as a Council, I think we do a lot of good works. Let's keep it up.


