Dear Brother Knights and Families,

As we enter the month of October, we can all look forward to the coming beatification of our founder, the Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, which will take place at a special Mass planned for Oct. 31 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Hartford. Ahead of his time in giving the laity an important role within the church, he will continue to be in the forefront by becoming the first American parish priest to be beatified. He accomplished a great deal in his 38-year life, which ended due to complications from pneumonia during an outbreak of what was called the Russian flu in 1890. Fastforward 130 years from his time and it seems some things have not changed a great deal: we are in the midst of a pandemic and Catholicism is still enduring attacks, among other national and international troubles. But as Knights we also have the benefit of Fr. McGivney's legacy and vision as informed by his - and our - Catholic faith to help us navigate a seemingly chaotic world. With good reason we pray that the example of his life and virtue may inspire us to follow Jesus Christ more closely. Fr. McGivney's founding principles of our Order -

McGivney's founding principles of our Order – Charity, Unity, and Fraternity – each one dependent on the other two, continue to be as relevant today as they were in the 19th Century because they reflect facets of our timeless Catholic faith. Let us always strive to emulate Fr. McGivney and continue praying for his canonization. I can say that I am truly inspired by the

many acts of devotion to our Order's principles and to our Church that are performed by our own Brother Knights. Thank you for all that you do and may God continue to bless us.

4th Degree Exemplification October 31, 2020

Brothers,

The next 4th Degree Exemplification for the Virginia District is scheduled for Saturday, October 31st. Incidentally, that will be the same day our Order's founder, the Venerable Fr. Michael J. McGivney, will be Beatified, bringing him one step closer to Sainthood!

Originally, the Exemplification was planned to be in Virginia Beach... however, this morning it was announced that it will be done as a virtual live-stream event. To accommodate a viewing of the Exemplification, we have already reserved the school gym at St. Leo's.

Any 3rd Degree member of the Order interested in taking the 4th Degree on this occasion is encouraged to do so... if for no other reason, to honor our Order's founder! All you need to do is complete a Form 4 (Application for 4th Degree), and submit a check for \$50 (this Initiation Fee is set by Supreme!). Then on October 31st, we would ask you to arrive at the school gym no later than 11:30 AM for the Noon Exemplification (we have some processing we need to do upon your arrival, including notifying the District Master of your attendance). The Exemplification takes about an hour and a half... so it should be completed by 1:30 PM. We will have someone on hand to Knight each Candidate at the conclusion of the ceremony. Attire for Candidates is dark suit (black, blue, or dark gray; jacket & trousers should match), white dress shirt (no button down collars or French cuffs), conservative/traditional style tie (no bow-tie or bolo tie), and dark dress shoes & dark socks.

Any 4th Degree Sir Knight who wishes to attend is welcome to do so. We will need a good number of Sir Knights in Official Regalia Dress-Service to be available to assist as Escorts. All other Sir Knights may attend in Official Regalia Dress-Social, or in Social Dress Uniform (if you do not have the ORD).
