“In a special way, we remember the brave men and women of the military who work tirelessly, even to the point of sacrificing their own lives, to bring about true peace rooted in justice,” he added.

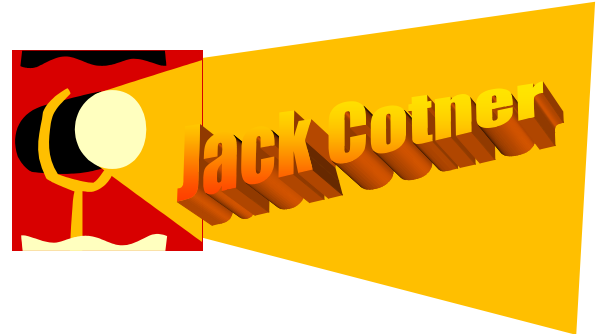

**"Rewards for Participation" Program/Contest
For Fraternal Year 2006-07**

Concept

Create a rewards program for Council participation. Will be useful when trying to gather volunteers and recruit new members.

This prize will include

- A cruise for 2 people for 3 days to the destination of choice (choice from 3 specific trips - details forthcoming)
- Airfare - up to \$400 of the cost
- * Note: if the winner chooses to, upgrades are available from the cruise line (cabin upgrade, number of days, etc.)

Eligibility

Every Knight would be eligible with the exception of:

- The Grand Knight
- The Deputy Grand Knight
- Program Committee Chairmen (in their own events - eligible in others)
- As well as any Knight who willingly "exempts" himself - voluntarily from the drawing

General Outline of "Rules"

Earn "Ticket(s)" for each event one participates in:

- 1 for every meeting attended (exception: officers and positions who are supposed to be there)
- 1 for any event in which your name is turned in (as determined by the program chairman/coordinator)
- 1 for joining the council ("immediately eligible to win . . .")
- A weighted bonus for each Knight a member recruits - so it encourages recruitment as well:
 - 1 for a Form 100; 2 more if the member joins
- Scrip Sales to others - effort of making contact and sales, as determined by Larry Novack (for example each \$1,000 sold)
- Just some examples of events:
 - Rosary
 - Family Breakfast
 - Each Christmas Tree shift (as many as you - could be 4-5 or more)
 - An Ovarions Event
 - Feed the Homeless
 - And so on . . . (a complete list could be compiled)
- Each Knight can accumulate as many tickets (chances) as they can during the year, but the final selection is a drawing (so it is a lottery - luck plays a part). More participation means a better chance to win, but any participation could win it for you.
- Special Note: If a Columbiette works an event (participates with a Knight) that earns a chance for that Knight as well) - in recognition of all the valuable contributions the Columbiettes make.
- Tickets will be compiled by [Ben Stack](#) (volunteered to track the program) - based on activity sheets turned in by the activity chair person (or whoever coordinates the event). Could keep a running total (subject to audit by Hank - so all know what their chances are)
- Tickets are not "transferable" - but the prize is. We do not have to assign a name until the winner is selected. So if a Brother Knight wins, but wants to give it to an older child/couple in their family - or parents, or a friend - they can.
- **Winner must be an active member of Council 6292 in good standing (dues paid) to win.** In the event that a member of another council somehow got their name on a ticket - that would not count.
- We will have the final drawing at the Grand Knight's Ball in June 2007 - would definitely add some excitement and interest!

Funding

This was an important point. Rather than be a burden to the council - or tap any funds or require a fundraiser for this - the funding for the main prize is being provided by voluntary contributions from officers and those that wanted to support this idea. Contact [Bill Ward](#) to contribute.

Rules/Flexibility

Any change or additional rules would be agreed upon by the GK and Program Chairs as well as the officers of the council. Decisions will be made on a case-by-case basis how to handle a new event or variations that may arise.

Note: This is a one time program - not necessarily continuing. Benefits include closer auditing of volunteer hours, recruiting and membership and increase of contact between members (more communication).

Fraternal Benefits Advisor's Message:

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the beneficiary originally designated to receive the proceeds from that policy needs to be updated. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse, and even your children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary – that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary – an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

When I call to arrange your annual “insurance check-up,” one of the matters that we can discuss is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can usually complete the paperwork during the appointment.

I look forward to meeting with you to review all your life insurance policies.
