
"In a special way, we remember the brave men and women of the military who work tirelessly, even to the point of sacrificing their own lives, to bring about true peace rooted in justice," he added.



KOVAR - Knights of Virginia Assisting the Retarded

In 1971 a group of Virginia Knights seeing the unfulfilled needs of the Citizens of Virginia with Mental Retardation decided they had to do something about it and KOVAR was formed. It began as a small effort and through the generosity of the Knights of Virginia, their families and the citizens of Virginia, it has grown into the largest non-governmental fund raising charity in Virginia specifically dedicated to helping citizens with mental retardation. This year we will make a grant that will push the total since 1971 to over 12 million dollars. To date our Council has raised \$460,622 of the states overall total. Our effort earlier this calendar year netted \$26,478.

Because of the efforts of the Knights of Virginia, their families, supporters and the generous people of Virginia we have over the years been able to ensure that many people who would otherwise be in state care facilities are in small, friendly group homes. Additionally you have helped to provide safe transportation, job training, recreational opportunities and health care initiatives that were in great need. Many facilities serving citizens with mental retardation have been up-graded, improved, and made safer. The list goes on and on. All of this would not have occurred without your efforts and the efforts of the brothers who preceded you.

Latest Information from Supreme Council

A Message from the Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson

Everyone who had the opportunity to meet, visit with, listen to or simply be in the presence of Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone at our convention earlier this month could not help but be impressed by the joy and hope he radiated. The Vatican secretary of state surely felt among friends at our 125th Supreme Convention, and he demonstrated it.

He brought personal greetings from Pope Benedict XVI to the convention. He also expressed his personal interest in the cause for sainthood of Father Michael J. McGivney, a priest he called "prophetic" and "truly well ahead of his time." As important, he spoke directly to what our Order needs to do during our anniversary year — and beyond — to live out our convention theme of Witnessing to the 'Yes' of Jesus Christ.

Addressing the convention on three different occasions, and at a press conference for Catholic media, Cardinal Bertone noted appreciatively the vital, active and "alive spirit" of the Church in America in general and of our Order in particular.

Like any good pastor, he also brought challenging words of counsel and advice. While the cardinal praised our Order's charitable activities, he reminded us that our good works can lose their deeper meaning if they do not remain "rooted" in our faith.

Cardinal Bertone also urged us to do more to reach out to young people, holding up Father McGivney, Pope John Paul II and St. John Bosco, founder of his own religious order, the Salesians, as models for this program of the new evangelization.

By inviting Cardinal Bertone to our anniversary year convention and presenting him with our Gaudium et Spes (Joy and Hope) Award, we knew we were honoring a great Church leader, statesman and pastor. The honor, it turns out, was all ours.

Knights of Columbus reaffirms opposition to abortion, embryonic stem cell research Resolution calls for laws to protect rights of conscience for medical personnel

(NASHVILLE, TN) - Delegates to the 125th annual convention of the Knights of Columbus today unanimously adopted a resolution reaffirming its "deep commitment to oppose any governmental action or policy that promotes abortion, embryonic stem cell research, human cloning, euthanasia, assisted suicide and other offenses against life."

The resolution, adopted during the final session of the convention at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel in Nashville, also called for "the adoption of laws that recognize and protect in law the right of conscience for doctors, nurses, pharmacists and other medical personnel, guaranteeing that they may not be forced to provide medical services which violate their religious beliefs." The resolution also called for "similar protection for Catholic hospitals."

Convention delegates also adopted resolutions expressing "Support for Natural Marriage," "Honoring Our Armed Forces," calling for "Decency in the Media and on the Internet," and calling for "continued use of "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The convention celebrated the 125th anniversary of the Knights of Columbus, which was founded in New Haven, CT in 1882. Among the highlights of the convention was attendance by Vatican Secretary of State Tarcissio Bertone, who delivered a major address Wednesday evening, and who expressed strong support for the cause for sainthood of the founder of the Knights, Fr. Michael J. McGivney.
