Grand Knight's Awards—2019-2020 Fraternal Year

Family of the Year



The nominee family life demonstrates strong Christian values and boundless energy and love for the poor, especially those who are in desperate need. They serve as a model family in our parish and our community. They perform each of the seven corporal works of mercy on a regular basis in all of their activities in their daily lives. They do not just take care of the parish community or the local community but also their extended Philippine community.

This family has participated in the Feed the Homeless Project for over 25 years by preparing home-cooked meals to serve in D.C. They also prepare lunch for approximately 200 homeless on Wednesdays at CCNV shelter. Special meals are prepared for approximately 500 at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter, which is supported by the Council, local friends and youth groups, and prepares the Thanksgiving Meal at the Lamb Center for approximately 150 homeless. They provided financial support for Christmas dinners to 25 families in Carless, 110110 Province, Philippines.

They also cook weekly for Fairfax Volunteer Fire Department Bingo in support of raising the funds necessary for their charitable activities. They serve as an active member of the Divine Mercy organization and prepared all of the food for their March Retreat. They coordinated the Sambaing Gabi celebration and were instrumental in rejuvenating participation. The family is involved with the preparation and delivery of Council meals.

After the devastation for those who lost their lives during typhoon Yolanda that tore through the Central Philippines killing over 9,000, the family went on a mission to build 12 homes and has returned to continue supporting this project. The family bought 3 fishing boats to allow men to make a living after the typhoon. The nominee family has been instrumental in managing many fundraisers needed to support the building of over 25 new homes for those who lost their homes destroyed by the 2019 earthquake. The nominee's wife recently traveled to the Philippines to assist in directing the building of homes and a church for villagers in the Philippines and feeding the weary workers. Chapels have been built in the Philippines using the support the family has given. For all the work that this family is involved in it gives me great pleasure to present the 2019-2020 Family of the Year award to Thelma and George Billy.

Knight of the Year

He serves as a Eucharistic Minister at masses both on weekends and during the week, which includes delivering communion and praying with the home-bound.

He has served as the Council's Charity Chairman for many years. In that role he was responsible for coordinating the Council's Program at St. Leo the Great Catholic Church with Social Services (formally St. Vincent DePaul Society). During that time, he was not only regularly collecting food for the Program, but he accepted the responsibility to organize the intake of food and supplies for the special delivery of meals three times a year: Christmas, Easter, and Thanksgiving, with more than fifty families being taken care of.

4th Degree Exemplification October 31, 2020

Brothers,

The next 4th Degree Exemplification for the Virginia District is scheduled for Saturday, October 31st. Incidentally, that will be the same day our Order's founder, the Venerable Fr. Michael J. McGivney, will be Beatified, bringing him one step closer to Sainthood!

Originally, the Exemplification was planned to be in Virginia Beach... however, this morning it was announced that it will be done as a virtual live-stream event. To accommodate a viewing of the Exemplification, we have already reserved the school gym at St. Leo's.

Any 3rd Degree member of the Order interested in taking the 4th Degree on this occasion is encouraged to do so... if for no other reason, to honor our Order's founder! All you need to do is complete a Form 4 (Application for 4th Degree), and submit a check for \$50 (this Initiation Fee is set by Supreme!). Then on October 31st, we would ask you to arrive at the school gym no later than 11:30 AM for the Noon Exemplification (we have some processing we need to do upon your arrival, including notifying the District Master of your attendance). The Exemplification takes about an hour and a half... so it should be completed by 1:30 PM. We will have someone on hand to Knight each Candidate at the conclusion of the ceremony. Attire for Candidates is dark suit (black, blue, or dark gray; jacket & trousers should match), white dress shirt (no button down collars or French cuffs), conservative/traditional style tie (no bow-tie or bolo tie), and dark dress shoes & dark socks.

Any 4th Degree Sir Knight who wishes to attend is welcome to do so. We will need a good number of Sir Knights in Official Regalia Dress-Service to be available to assist as Escorts. All other Sir Knights may attend in Official Regalia Dress-Social, or in Social Dress Uniform (if you do not have the ORD).
