"Building Up His Body"

This past weekend we celebrated the 143rd anniversary of the founding of our order by Blessed Michael McGivney on March 29, 1882 at St. Mary's Catholic Church in New Haven, Connecticut. Throughout our order's history, the Knights have stood true to Blessed McGivney's vision of protecting the weak and vulnerable, caring for the needy and the outcast. I cannot think of something that best sums up Blessed McGivney than the Litany of <u>Blessed McGivney</u>. Father McGiveny's vision set the tone for our work of feeding the homeless, supporting and promoting vocations, caring for the sick and the widowed, protecting the vulnerable, guiding the youth, spreading the faith, and so much more. Our founder serves as a role model, so much so that Bishop Burbidge included a statue of Blessed McGivney and a stained glass window in the newly renovated Cathedral of St. Thomas More.

In honor of Founders Day this past weekend, I want to encourage all who are not yet members to join the <u>Father McGivney Guild</u>. Membership in the guild is free as the guild serves to promote the cause for sainthood of our Blessed Michael McGivney. In addition to furthering our founder's cause for sainthood, you can also request prayer intentions, report any favors, and receive a quarterly newsletter. While the cause for sainthood of Father McGivney is important, it is important for each of us to seek his intention as we grow closer to God and build up his Body which is the Church.

Chaplain's Message

The 'Creeping to the Cross'

We are all familiar with the yearly Good Friday liturgy. It is not a Mass of course, and Mass is in fact forbidden on this day. It is as if on the one day on which our Lord completed the institution of the Mass with His Passion and Death, we must not have the Mass, so as not to distract from what He has done. And so, instead, we have the liturav of Good Friday.

gy of Good Friday. In this liturgy, there are several parts. An opening prayer, the readings, including the solemn reading or singing of the Passion of St. John, the solemn intercessions ("Let us kneel... Let us stand."), and of course the adoration of the Cross.

St. Thomas Aquinas, in line with the tradition of the mystics, taught that the Cross was so imbued with our Lord's Precious Blood, so closely identified with Him, that we could worship the Cross itself as we worship God (ST, III.25.4). Hence, when we reverence a relic of the True Cross, we genuflect instead of bow. Originally, the ceremony of the adoration of the Cross was done with a relic of the True Cross. Over time, this changed so that we reverenced an image of the Cross. But in both cases, it was the *wood* of the Cross that was reverenced ("Behold the wood of the Cross...") and not the image of our Lord on it. Nowadays, there are those that reverence the image, and this is not necessarily wrong, but it is not the original intention of the action.

In medieval England, a unique variant developed of this ritual, usually called the 'Creeping to the Cross.' It was very popular in medieval English devotion. The English would remove their shoes and 'creep' to the Cross on their knees as a penance and a sign of adoration. One could only do this slowly and with difficulty, increasing the time and hence the meditative aspect of the action. During this English Reformation, this was objected to by so-called 'reformers' as a superstition or idolatry, but the people loved the devotion. It was only put to an end with the legal and physical force of the state.

The adoration of the Cross now only calls for the removal of shoes from the celebrant, and it is an optional action. But as we come to the Cross this Good Friday, let us all remember the reverence shown by our ancestors to the Cross of our salvation, and adore the wood of the Cross with full hearts and with reverence in our hearts.


