Deputy Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

As we enter the months of July and August, we remember the Catholic Church dedicates the month of July to the Precious Blood of Jesus and the month of August to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

"The Precious Blood which we worship is the Blood which the Savior shed for us on Calvary and reassumed at His glorious Resurrection; it is the Blood which courses through the veins of His risen, glorified, living body at the right hand of God the Father in heaven; it is the Blood made present on our altars by the words of Consecration; it is the Blood which merited sanctifying grace for us and through it washes and beautifies our soul and inaugurates the beginning of eternal life in it."

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart. Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. The month of August is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The physical heart of Mary is venerated (and not adored as the Sacred Heart of Jesus is) because it is united to her person and is the seat of her love (especially for her divine Son), virtue, and inner life. Such devotion is an incentive to a similar love and virtue.

This devotion has received new emphasis in this century from the visions given to Lucy Dos Santos, oldest of the visionaries of Fatima, in her convent in Tuy, in Spain, in 1925 and 1926. In the visions Our Lady asked for the practice of the Five First Saturdays to help make amends for the offenses committed against her heart by the blasphemies and ingratitude of men. The practice parallels the devotion of the Nine First Fridays in honor of the Sacred Heart.

On October 31, 1942, Pope Pius XII made a solemn Act of Consecration of the Church and the whole world to the Immaculate Heart. Let us remember this devotion year-round, but particularly through the month of August.

Many thanks to all the Knights who have contributed in any way to our Council this past year, through service or through simple prayers. We are so fortunate through the Grace of God to have such a strong group of Men dedicated to the ideals of our order, Fraternity, Charity, and Unity.


Father Diamond Council Gift to Father Juan

Chaplain's Message

The 25th of July is celebrated in many parts of the world, especially in the Spanish-speaking world, as the Feast of St. James the Greater. 'The greater' most likely refers to his height, not his importance. The recent series *The Chosen* refers to them as 'Big James' and 'Little James,' a fair translation. St. James is the other half of the 'Sons of Thunder' or the sons of Zebedee, the two most rash and energetic of the apostles (Mk 3:17; cf. Lk 9:51-56). The brothers are famous for wanting to sit at the right and left of our Lord when He comes in glory (Mk 10:35-45, Mt 20:20-28). St. Luke tells us that this St. James was the first of the apostles to be martyred, beheaded by Herod Agrippa, perhaps ultimately a divine fulfillment of his desire for greatness (Acts 12:2). His head is said to be buried in the Armenian Cathedral of St. James in Jerusalem, built over the spot of his beheading.

According to tradition, St. James the Greater preached in Roman Hispania (modern Spain) before returning to Jerusalem and his martyrdom. The story of our Lady of the Pillar recounts how when he was in Caesaraugusta (modern Zaragoza), our Lady appeared to him to encourage him.

The tradition of the Camino de Santiago is also based on his connection with Spain. The medieval *Golden Legend* passes down the ancient story of its origins. The disciples of St. James set his relics in a boat and entrusted them to the Holy Spirit. They found their way to Galicia in northwestern Spain, to the kingdom of the wicked Queen Lupa. His disciples followed their master's remains, and had many adventures trying to bury them and build him a worthy tomb. Eventually, by many miracles, they buried him near Compostela, and the wicked queen even converted and was baptized. Centuries later, a hermit named Pelagius found the tomb again and the pilgrimages began to see the tomb of the holy apostle. Eventually, the great basilica of Santiago de Compostela was built as the ultimate destination of the pilgrimage. It remains the most famous pilgrimage route in the world.

Though his cult remains popular mainly in the Spanish-speaking world, the example of St. James has much to teach us about zeal for the truth, perseverance, and divine providence. The Camino de Santiago remains a crucible of faith for those that take it. And thus, the influence of the great apostle has not yet passed from this earth. He still leads us in pilgrimage to our divine Master.



Chancellor's Report

Brother Knights:

Just because it's summer doesn't mean we should stop recruiting new Knights! Whether you're at the pool, at a backyard BBQ with friends, at the store, helping with an event, or even leaving the church after Mass, there are lots of opportunities to talk with guys about the Knights!

The objective is simple. If you know a Catholic guy, 18 years old or older, challenge them to become a Knight. There's no risk, and no set, ongoing participation requirement.

All they have to do is go to the Knight's website: www.kofc.org, and select the "Join Us" prompt. A page should come up that says 'join online for free'.

Give them the 'promo code', BLESSEDMCGIVNEY – (Their membership for the first year will be free. After that it's about \$50 per year.) – Then they just need to fill in the online application like they would for anything else. It's super easy and only takes a couple minutes.

They'll have to confirm they are, '[I am] a baptized Catholic male', and that they are, '[I am] a practical Catholic'. (A 'practical Catholic' is someone who accepts the Catholic Church's teachings on faith and morals, lives in accordance with the Church's precepts, and is in good standing with the Church. They're also known to love their family, home, and church, and to stand up for their faith.)

After they fill in their mailing address there are two questions.

The first is, 'Preferred Local Council'... they should enter: 6292.

The second is, 'Member Referral Number'... they can enter: 3362370

Last, they should enter the promo code (BLESSEDMCGIVNEY) and click 'ADD'. When they do, the \$30 membership fee should turn to -\$0-. When they click the last couple validation boxes and they're done.

After joining online they'll receive an email confirming their membership and providing more information. Within a few days they'll also be contacted by a Knight to talk to you about next steps, and answer any questions they may have.

It's never been more important, or easier to become a Knight. Catholic men need to stand up for what's right!
