#### Chaplain's Message

Father James Joseph, Council Chaplain Crist lim. Crist remam. Crist imm degaid. Crist innum. Crist ísum. Crist úasam. Crist dessum. Crist tuathum. -The Lorica of St. Patrick, 9<sup>th</sup> century

Every Lent on March 17<sup>th</sup>, we look forward to the celebration of one of our most beloved saints, St. Patrick, the great apostle to the Irish. Many of us will be familiar with the words of St. Patrick Breastplate, or the Lorica of St. Patrick. Its beautiful lines have a way of staying with you: Christ with me, Christ before me, Christ behind me, Christ in me, Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ on my right, Christ on my left, Christ when I lie down, Christ when I sit down, Christ when I arise. Variously translated into English in poetry and set to music for hundreds of years, it's worth another read this year.

Its Gaelic name is Fáeth Fiada, or the 'Déer's Cry.' According to legend reported in the early versions of the Lorica, when pagan bandits once lay in wait to ambush them, St. Patrick and his fellow missionaries chanted the Lorica for divine protection. Instantly, they miraculously appeared to the bandits like deer instead of men and they were saved. The name is also a reference to Irish mythology. The Féth fiada, or 'lordly mist' is the ethereal mist which surrounds and protects the gods, a legend appropriated by Irish Christians for the God's protection of the saints.

<sup>1</sup> Ever since Thomas Cahill's 1995 book, *How the Irish Saved Civilization*, academics have known the immense debt western Christendom and civilization owe the Irish Church. While the light of learning in Europe went out after the fall of Rome, it continued to burn in the monasteries of Celtic Ireland. We in the Church have known this for ages. St. Patrick's Day gives us a chance to appreciate the unique genius and contributions of the Irish to our common Christian life. Through poverty, famine, and persecution, they have carried the torch of the Faith through the centuries.

Now, though many of them sadly seem to have lost the Faith, we may pray they recover it. When Catholic Ireland is strong, all of Christendom thrives.
