Chaplain's Message

Perhaps you, like me, remember that wonder, old, bad joke from childhood, *April showers bring May flowers, but what do Mayflowers bring? Pilgrims!* But May also brings something more important. May is our Lady's month. It's known for its flowers, good weather, and for the peaceful beauty of spring, all things which remind us of our Lady in all her grace and beauty. In May, parishes and schools usually crown our Lady's image in the church with flowers in that wonderful Catholic tradition of May crowning.

I once had an atheist friend of mine comment on the mysteries of our Lady, asking how a person could believe in something which sounds so fanciful as a heavenly crowning. Isn't just a nice-sounding symbol or myth? But this misses the point completely. C.S. Lewis has an essay called "Transposition," where he deals with this kind of problem.

Because Christianity uses symbolic language – crowns, clouds, halos, harps – to represent realities beyond human conception, it does not mean that we think there are really such bodily things, literally in heaven. He tells an allegory to show what he means. Suppose, he says, there exists a woman and her son who are thrown into a dungeon while the child is still small. He does not remember the outside world, so his mother draw him pictures so he can imagine what things are like on the outside. But one day, he learns that the outside world is not really pencil marks on a page, and he is taken by great surprise and confusion. It is difficult to explain that those pencil lines were only standing in for a reality much greater than he can understand. "The child," he writes, "will get the idea that the real world is somehow less visible than his mother's pictures. In reality it lacks lines because it is incomparably more visible" ("Transposition" in *The Weight of Glory*, 110).

Our Lady may in reality have a real crown. She has a real head and a real body on which to hold it. But we cannot get bogged down in the ultimately unimportant question of our Lady's eternal headwear. Much more important is the honor her Son bestows on her, His great love without end which made her higher than the angels. This is her crown of twelve stars which makes her the mother of the Church and her twelve princes, the apostles (Rev 12:1). Whether or not she wears one on her head, that is her true crown.

Chancellor's Report

Brother Knights:

This message is a little different from most; I thought I would share an excerpt from a reflection by Fr. Robert B. Manansala, OFM.

"The Knights of Columbus' fraternal motto is: 'Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori,' 'Time Flies, Remember Death.' According to John P. Martin, a PGK of Council 14557, New Bedford, Massachusetts, 'the Knights of Columbus are called to constantly reflect on the fact that we have only a short earthly existence in which to prove ourselves worthy of eternal life.' Martin traces this motto 'Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori' to the Knights of Columbus' Founder Fr. Michael J. McGivney's commitment to an immigrant parish consisting of hard working men and women – who died young. Fr. McGivney himself succumbed to death due to pneumonia at the age of 36. 'Vanity of vanities! All things are vanity!' All things are passing, all things are transient. Time flies, remember death. Remember that you will die. This may sound frightening, but it is true. This is not being pessimistic; it is just being realistic. Life on earth is short when seen from the perspective of eternity."

Remember and pray for the intersession of St. Joseph the Worker this month of May. Pray for all those who toil in the vineyard. Offer-up your pains and aches for all the poor souls in purgatory, especially those who have no one to pray for them. And, pray that the Church's Cardinals are guided by the Holy Spirit in selecting our next Holy Father.
