## Deputy Grand Knight's Report

Brothers,

As we enter the month of February we remember it is dedicated to the Holy Family. The special devotion which proposes the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph as the model of virtue of all Christian households began in the 17th century. It started almost simultaneously in Canada and France: the Association of the Holy Family was founded in Montreal in 1663, and by the Daughters of the Holy Family in Paris in 1674. This devotion soon spread and in 1893 Leo XIII expressed his approval of a feast under this title and himself composed part of the Office. On account of the flight into Egypt this feast has been observed by the Copts from early times. The feast was welcomed by succeeding Pontiffs as an efficacious means for bringing home to the Christian people the example of the Holy Family at Nazareth, and by the restoration of the true spirit of family life, stemming, in some measure, the evils of present-day society.

In the words of His Holiness Pope Leo XIII, "Nothing truly can be more salutary or efficacious for Christian families to meditate upon than the example of this Holy Family, which embraces the perfection and completeness of all domestic virtues."

## All Saints Car Raffle

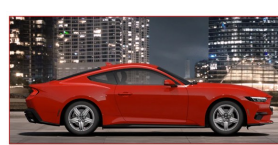

### Chaplain's Message

Last year in February, I drew attention to the feast of Candlemas, on which we celebrate the growing Light of Christ in the darkness of midwinter. This is the feast of our Lady's Purification, in which she submitted to the Law of Moses to redeem her firstborn son in the Temple in Jerusalem. But this is not the only unfortunately overlooked feast in February.

February 14 is still observed in some places as the feast of St. Valentine, commonly called Valentine's Day by many who often do not know he is a saint. There is some difficulty with St. Valentine, as there appear to be several martyr saints by that name from late antiquity. 'Valens' means 'strong,' (there was an emperor called Valens, r. 364-378) and was a very popular name at the time. The Roman Martyrology, however, the Church's official listing of the martyrs, makes note of a martyr called Valentine who died on the *via Flaminia*, the road out of Rome leading northeast. He is thought to have lived somewhere around the third century. According to tradition, the remains of St. Valentine were kept for many years in his burial place, a catacomb on the *via Flaminia*. Later, they were placed in churches in Rome. A discerning pilgrim can still find his skull in a reliquary house by the church of Santa Maria in Cosmedin – more famous for the Mouth of Truth, a stone face outside the church, in the mouth of which tourists stick their hands. The legend (made famous in the 1953 movie *Roman Holiday*) is that the mouth will bite off the hand of someone who swears falsely.

The story of St. Valentine is uncertain, as all that is known for sure is his name and his martyrdom. He may have been a priest of Rome, or perhaps the bishop of Terni, a city that still reveres a bishop named Valentine as its patron. But there are other common stories about him. The tale is often told that he preached before the emperor, enraging him and causing his own beheading. That he performed miracles. And most common of all, that he married Christian couples in secret, after the emperor forbade marriage for a time to encourage the focused training of his soldiers. This last is how he became a patron of love and romance.

Because of the uncertainty of information about him, he was dropped from the universal calendar in 1969. But St. Valentine remains a saint, and whatever the truth about him, he is still in heaven and can pray for us.
