Please come out and volunteer for a shift or 2. It's very important that we have every single slot filled to maximize the dollars being raised for KOVAR. I strongly urge each of you to please give us 3 or 6 hours of your time with this worthy cause.

While talking about KOVAR, I can't fail to recognize John Hogan and all the employees at Hogan and Sons Goodyear. Through voluntary payroll deductions, they have raised over \$2,900 in contributions to KOVAR. This is the single highest contribution our council has received. Thanks for the help, John!




