KOVAR 2009

KOVAR, an acronym for Knights of Virginia Assisting the Retarded, is a Virginia chartered statewide non profit organization providing funds to organizations that provide for those with intellectual disabilities. A major fund raiser is done once a year throughout the state, shortly after Easter, by distributing specially marked Tootsie Rolls in front of local businesses and asking for donations.

Turning rolls of chewy chocolates into a financial boom for organizations that serve the mentally retarded is a wonder Story. These treats bring in nearly \$2 million profit annually in Illinois – the home base for the creation of this giant fund raising process run by the Knights of Columbus.

Forty years have passed since a group of three Knights from a Council in the Chicago area saw a need that was two way: organizations that served people with mental retardation needed money and the Knights of Columbus in Illinois needed a charitable mission to offer their members. The Knights knew that the Lions, the Shriners, the Elks and other fraternal organizations had members who reached out to the community with a determined focused project.

The men had no difficulty determining the target of their fund raising – the money would go to the mentally retarded because one of the group had a daughter who was mentally retarded and recognized that this category of people needed financial assistance. The process that they planned to use was not too difficult either: they would stand in public places with a receptacle and solicit donations for a token product.

However, the product took some thought. One idea was to distribute seed packets of Forget-Me-Not flowers which provided a good marketing slogan "For the retarded-forget me not". There were concerns however, that many people would not want seeds, would not use them and say no. The next thought was a Tootsie Roll, a well-established candy from a Chicago based company.

The three decided that the Tootsie Roll would be a good item to use because it was a well recognized item with a good shelf life. The next step was to pilot the program in their own K of C Council in Tinley Park. IL.

They picked a weekend, got men from their Council and got the candy from the Tootsie Roll Company. The men from the council stood at busy stores and intersections with a canister and Tootsie Rolls. They asked for a small donation from the shoppers and passer-bys, for each contribution handed out the candy. The first time collection was highly successful, raising over \$30,000 for the two day effort.

With that encouragement the council submitted a resolution to the state K of C convention to have the candy drive become a statewide program. The resolution was adopted unanimously. From that first drive in 1970 with receipts of \$30,000, the Illinois councils have increased their annual profit to nearly two million annually.

The campaign has spread to other states when news of the success in Illinois was published in K of C magazines and newsletters. From the efforts of the one council in Tinley Park, IL the drive to raise funds for people with mental retardation has expanded to 44 states.

Our Virginia State Council in 1971 formed the State program known as KOVAR (Knights of Virginia Assisting the Retarded) using the specially wrapped Tootsie Roll as the vehicle to raise funds for programs which is know known as "for those with intellectual disabilities". The collections began in 1972. Since that beginning KOVAR has distributed over Twelve Million dollars in Grants and Group Home Loans to over 250 ongoing organizations including the Special Olympics. KOVAR has become the largest private charity supporting the intellectually disabled in Virginia. KOVAR is now just a name. The name was changed in August 2008 when papers were filed with the State Corporation Commission to change the name from Knights of Virginia Assisting the Retarded to just KOVAR, as a name and not an acronym. This was done because agencies and activities supporting the "Intellectually Disabled" programs do not wish to be associated with the politically incorrect "Mentally Retarded" label". This name change does not alter the purpose of the KOVAR as it was when it was initially founded

Our Council first participated in KOVAR in 1975 and since then we have raised \$477,246. Since KOVAR started our Council has been a major contributor of funds for the program. Our established goal for this years drive is \$23,554, last year we raised \$20,512. One of our sources of income toward our goal is your contributions to KOVAR through the annual United Way, Combined Federal Campaign and Combined Virginia Campaigns. If you did make a pledge to KOVAR this past fall please give a copy of your pledge document to Herb Zimmerman, our Treasurer. We need a copy of your pledge so that we can have the documentation to get credit for that pledge toward our goal

This years Statewide Drive is the 16th to 19th of April with a goal of \$622,000. Please save some time that weekend to help in our collection effort, the more sites that we can cover the better our overall result will be. Please call Bill Weich at 301 527 1207 if you can help, enlist you wife and children to help, children make great collectors. If you can't help, please consider making a tax deductible donation to help us achieve our goal. Make out check to KOVAR and send it to the Council or bring it in no later than April 18th.

Did You Know . .

New Directive on Pledge of Allegiance

As you all know, we have been adding the words "for the born and the unborn" to the end of the Pledge of Allegiance for a long time. As you also know, these words are not part of the official Pledge of Allegiance which ends with the words "with liberty and justice for all".

The Supreme Council continues to fight the battle on behalf of all of us to keep the words "under God" in our official pledge. They will continue to fight this battle. They will also continue the battle to defend Life from conception until natural end. All of us can be proud of their efforts in both of these areas.

However, they are concerned that adding the words "for the born and the unborn" to the end of the pledge might lead people to believe that we think of the born and unborn as different. This is certainly not true. They are also concerned that the "appearance" of our changing the Pledge could open up the debate even further to eliminate the words "under God" from the official pledge.

Accordingly, effective immediately, we are directed to not add the words "for the born and the unborn" to the end of the pledge. We are also reminded that the words "one nation" and the words "under God" do not have any punctuation between them and should be said as one phrase -- "one nation under God".

I know that not saying the additional words at the end of the Pledge is a major change for all of us. However, we as Catholics and as Knights will continue to believe that life begins at conception and therefore all human life is considered when we say "with liberty and justice for all". Our Supreme Master, along with the Supreme Council, is asking all Knights to use the correct pledge and drop the additional wording. Remember, this does not, in any way, change our sanctity of life stance or beliefs that show in many other ways.

Please be advised that while this advice is coming through the Fourth Degree, it applies to the Councils as well as the Assemblies. Our Vice Supreme Master has sent a note to all of the State Deputies in the Calvert Province as well as the Regional Program Consultants.

Thanks for your help and cooperation in making this change happen. Should anyone have any questions or comments, please let me know.


