KOVAR 2011

In 1971 the Virginia State Council formed the program known as KOVAR (which originally stood for Knights of Virginia Assisting the Retarded) using the specially wrapped Tootsie Roll as the vehicle to raise funds for programs to assist people with intellectual disabilities. Since the collections began in 1972 more than \$12,000,000 in Grants and Group Home Loans have been awarded to over 250 organizations including the Special Olympics.

Our Council first participated in KOVAR in 1975 and since then we have raised \$518,101 and is a major contributor of funds for the program. Father Diamond Council has 1.5% of the members in Virginia and we have raised more than 4.3% of the State's total.

Our assigned goal for this year's drive is \$23,554. One of our sources toward our goal is your contributions to KOVAR through the annual United Way, Combined Federal Campaign and Combined Virginia Campaigns. If you did make a pledge to KOVAR this past year, please give a copy of your pledge document to Herb Zimmerman, our Treasurer. The documentation contributes toward the Council goal. Our main source of income is from Brothers Knights who stand three-hour shifts at various stores in our area.

This year's drive is from May 19th through 22nd. The Chairman for this year's drive is Mike Purtill. Please save some time that weekend to help in our collection effort. Please call Mike at 202 251 8424 if you can help. Wives and children are convincing collectors, so please consider making it a family affair. If you can't help, please consider making a tax deductible donation to help us achieve our goal.
