Grand Knight's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

About a week ago I received a message from the General Programs Chairman for the Virginia Knights of Columbus. He congratulated us on achieving the



State Deputy Award. In case you never heard of that before, let me explain. The State Deputy Award is for all Councils who hold events (up to 4 different ones) in six different categories (Church, Community, Culture of Life, Family, Youth, and Council) within the year. The Council must also submit their candidate for Knight of the Year, Family of the Year, Outstanding Young Man of the Year, and Outstanding

Outstanding Young Man of the Year, and Outstanding Young Woman of the Year. In addition they must have held an event focused on Catholic Education and held or scheduled a Fraternal Benefits Night. The purpose of this award is to recognize those councils who perform the best and who drive to achieve excellence in representing the tenants of Knighthood (Charity, Unity and Fraternalism).

What is interesting about this award is that all councils must have submitted their forms and information, to the State General Programs Chairman, by March 31. We are only ¾ the way through our Fraternal year (which started July 1, 2015) and we have qualified for this Award.

The only event that we have not held as yet is the Fraternal Benefits Night. Leo Duran, our new Fraternal Benefits Advisor, has agreed to conduct this very informative event on Tuesday, April 26 as a substitute for the 2nd meeting in April. It will start at 8:00 PM. This is an open event. All wives are invited and encouraged to attend. Leo will make a presentation on all of the benefits we and our families are entitled to, as members of the Knights of Columbus. This is not just about insurance. There are many benefits to being a Knight, for example the Knights have a scholarship program that your kids and yes, even



The Knights of Columbus Collection in Support of Vocations

The "Penny Per Knight, Per Day" Program, commonly called "PKD," is based on the idea of each Knight donating one penny each day, or \$3.65 per year to the fund by passing the can at the meetings or if desired, by including their donations with their annual dues. All funds collected through the council's PKD collection are passed to the Virginia State Council for distribution through the state vocations program. Currently, there are checks given to the Bishops of Arlington and Richmond and the Archdiocese of Military Services for their respective vocations programs. Additionally, funds may be provided to individuals requiring assistance to continue their discernment to the priesthood or religious life.

The Refund Support Vocation Program (RSVP) is a Supreme Council administered program. This program rebates \$100.00 for every \$500.00 given to an individual in formations for a religious or priestly vocation. Our council typically supports a seminarian each year.


