Host Families Needed for Northern Ireland Peace Program

The Children's Friendship Project for Northern Ireland (CFPNI) is seeking local families to help with the peace and reconciliation effort in Northern Ireland. Please consider hosting a pair of Protestant and Roman Catholic teens (boys or girls ages 15-18) in your home for four weeks this summer. To be eligible, families must provide a safe-neutral setting for the teens to get to know one another, a single bedroom for them to share, and day-long adult supervision. During the teens' stay, they attend a leadership conference on Capitol Hill and other teambuilding and social activities, although the majority of their time is spent enjoying the host family's normal routine. CFPNI is a national, all-volunteer peace program aimed at building trust, understanding and friendship among the next generation of leaders in Northern Ireland. Morality in the Media

My Brother Knights, a few weeks ago we assed a charitable contribution for Morality in the Media (MIM) and the question was asked, what is it for? It just so happened that the latest Supreme newsletter had a brief synopsis.

MIM was founded in 1962 to alert and inform citizens and public officials about the destructive effects of pornography and encourages the enforcement of obscenity laws. The Knights of Columbus has stood against pornography, violence, and indecency in the media for decades. The Supreme Council and our supreme knight have urged each council to support MIM by renewing its yearly organization membership or joining MIM for the first time. The yearly \$50 membership fee helps MIM in its battle to eradicate pornography. The activities that MIM get involved in include; sponsoring a clearinghouse of legal information on obscenity cases and materials for prosecutors and interested attorneys and an annual "Turn Off TV Day" as a protest against the growing number of TV programs that assault moral and family values. To find the dates and times for all of their events, as well as helpful information regarding protecting children from internet pornography, counseling for adults, and many other programs and topics, you can go to their Web site at wwwmoratityinrnedia.org. Another site run by MIM is www.obsenitycrimes.org, which offers a link to report a web address that is being used as a hidden pornography site. From the period of June 2002 to December 2003 obsenitycrimes.org had reported over 37,000 Web addresses that masked as pornography. Once reported, MIM will forward the names to prosecutors in the attempt to build cases against those trying to deceive our children and loved ones into "accidentally" going onto a pornographic site. 


