Council 6292 Resolution to Delete Standing Resolution adopted April 14, 1992

WHEREAS: The 1992 Resolution to expand Providence Hall was brought to the Pastor of St. Leo the Great shortly after incorporation into our By-laws, and

WHEREAS: The Pastor denied Council 6292 permission to expand substantially Providence Hall because any further expansion of St. Leo the Great property was not allowed by City Council without substantial modification to all facilities on the property, and

WHEREAS: The standing resolution creates confusion and unnecessary burden on Each Grand Knight and the Council since the Council proposed expansion was denied,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that Council 6292 Standing Resolution adopted April 14, 1992 be rescinded and deleted from further printing of the Council By-Laws

The above resolution will be voted on at the Council Meeting on December 9th or January 13th. Please plan to attend so you may cast your vote on this resolution




