



In 1971 a group of Virginia Knights seeing the unfulfilled needs of the Citizens of Virginia with Mental Retardation decided they had to do something about it and KOVAR was formed. It began as a small effort and through the generosity of the Knights of Virginia, their families and the citizens of Virginia, it has grown into the largest non-governmental fund raising charity in Virginia specifically dedicated to helping citizens with mental retardation. The Knights of Virginia have raised 12 million dollars since it's interception in 1971. Our Council has raised over \$481,000 since when we started participating in 1975

Because of the efforts of the Knights of Virginia, their families, supporters and the generous people of Virginia we have over the years been able to ensure that many people who would otherwise be in state care facilities are in small, friendly group homes. Additionally you have helped to provide safe transportation, job training, recreational opportunities and health care initiatives that were in great need. 
