
Christmas Tree Sale—Biggest Fund Raiser of the YEAR—Your Help is Needed!!





2010 Christmas Food Basket & Gift Program

Father Diamond Council is again teaming up with St Leo's SVDP to provide Holiday Food Baskets to the needy at Christmas. The new procedure for distribution of Holiday Food Baskets is described in the October Council Newsletter. The council will provide SVDP \$900 in gift cards for turkeys and perishable goods for 45 Families. The food baskets will be distributed on Saturday December 18 from the SVDP Pantry directly to the recipients instead of being delivered to their residences.



Food for the baskets is brought to the Christmas Tree Trailer or directly to the Food Pantry behind the church. Individual members desiring to purchase a food basket can use the attached list of suggested food items as a guideline for what and how much to purchase for the baskets. Food donations need to be delivered to the Christmas Tree Lot trailer or directly to the SVDP Food Pantry before Thursday, December 16.

The Council has been asked to assist in delivering the Christmas Presents collected as a result of the Giving Tree in the back of the church. We will need about 15 drivers to deliver all the gifts on Saturday, December 18.
