Brothers,


riet, wife Yvette, and Anne. We are told that Molly was the real master mind behind the winning chili.

How does it work? Father Diamond council buys food gift cards at a discount (5% for Giant and Shoppers Food Warehouse, and 4% for Safeway). We sell them to anyone at face value. If you, your family, friends or neighbors shop at any of these stores you can help the Council raise money for our scholarship funds.



Wednesday, January 22, 2014. The Virginia Knights offer support services as marshals that help with everything from crowd control to collecting money.

Father Diamond Council has collected money for the March since 1994. All the collected money goes to the National Right to Life Committee to help defray the cost of the March. We've been asked to help again in this effort and are looking for volunteers to collect money at the March and to count the money once it's returned to Providence Hall after the March.

We need your help because the more collectors we have the more money we collect. When we have over 20 collectors we are successful. Knight collectors line the March route and ask for donations. Last year we had over 30 collectors and it was one of our best years. Marchers leave the rally area and march down Constitution Avenue to the Supreme Court on Capitol Hill. Our Knights cover the first leg of the March with donation buckets.

We'll rent a bus again this year and leave Providence Hall as a group around 10:30 am on Wednesday the 22nd. We ask for a \$10 donation for the bus transportation. We ask volunteers to get to the Hall before 10:30 to pick up Marshal jackets and baseball caps. We have to arrive at the site before noon as DC police close the area off when the rally starts.

We've had many family participants over the years so if you have wives or teenage kids or grandkids bring them along. The kids that attend Catholic schools usually get a day off to attend the March. We have been blessed to have several participants from Paul VI in 2012 and 2013.


