

#### Chaplain's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

I hope you and your families had a wonderful Thanksgiving with lots of Turkey and Apple Pie! The priests at St. Leo are so grateful for your witness as Catholic men, husbands, fathers, grandfathers, and Knights of Columbus of the Father Diamond Counsel.

As we enter into December and the new liturgical year with the season of Advent, it is a good opportunity for us to look back at our liturgical year of 2023, and ask, where has God been present in my life? Just as we look back at the end of the calendar year and see all that has happened good or bad (our events, our holidays, our trips, births and deaths among family and friends, our work and our relationships) so we also can look back at the liturgical year and see what has happened good or bad in our life of faith. Our growth in the Kingdom of God (to constantly strive to become saintly, holy men) is like the mustard seed Jesus speaks about in the gospel! Growth happens slowly by God's grace and our cooperation with it. What kind of growth in holiness could we possibly be looking for, from this past year?

Some indicators could be measured. How often have I gone to confession? How often do I turn to God in prayer throughout my day? How much time do I spend in prayer? How intentional have I been with almsgiving? How often do I take time to Read the scriptures or the lives of the saints? However, there are also some other indicators in our growth in holiness that are not measurable but are no less real! They exist on the level of the heart. Perhaps we could ask: This past year, have I grown in my love of God and His Church? Have I grown in my love (interiorly and exteriorly) for my wife, my children, my siblings, my friends and coworkers? Have I worked to root out my predominant sin? Have I grown in all the virtues (Patience, humility, gratitude, generosity, fortitude, temperance, etc.)? How have I made use of my time, talent and treasures? These are just a few of the questions we could pose to ourselves in reflecting on this past year in our growth in holiness. Then, just like every calendar year we make goals for ourselves, what are the goals of my spiritual life for this Advent and this new liturgical year? A lot of questions to be sure! But it is important to examine our relationship with God, to not grow stagnant in our life with Him. And there is no better time than a new liturgical year! Simply to sit in the silence and ponder, where has God been present in my life?

May God bless you and your families during this season of Advent, as we prepare for Our God coming as a little child at Christmas!
