

Chaplain's Message

Advent is a time of waiting. Of course, we are waiting for the coming of Christ at Christmas. And yet, as we know, He has already come! As she does at Holy Week, the Church is 'playing' in a sense, with time

During Advent, we first remember that He came once before, in fulfillment of His promises to His Chosen People, Israel, which, 'he spoke through the prophets.' We recall with sadness the sin and exile of Israel's history, and we share – even all these years later – in the anticipation and longing with which they waited for their Messiah. that He is coming again. Secondly, we prepare worthily to receive Him, the new Advent which occurs every time we receive Holy Communion. Thirdly, following on the end of the old liturgical year, we remember the Four Last Things: Death, Judgment, Heaven, and Hell. We remember that 'He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead.'

There are, then, three comings in Advent. We remember and celebrate the First, we prepare ourselves for the Second, and we look forward to the Third. When we remember past or future events at Mass, it's not a reenactment or a stage play. As at Easter and at every Mass, the events become in a mysterious way present and real to us. We are one with the Jews of the Exodus, of the time of the kings, and of the time of our Lord. We know that when we receive Him into ourselves in the Eucharist, He is truly within us, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. We are present somehow to that future day on which He comes again.

Advent is indeed a time of waiting. Waiting for Him who has already come, waiting joyfully to receive Him now in the Mass, and waiting for Him whose time of arrival we cannot know. It is the waiting itself which is good for us. Because it is in this time of waiting in which we can ask ourselves: Do we remember what He told us when He came? How well do we receive Him now? Are we ready for Him to come again in glory?


Giant and Safeway Food Cards Buy Food - Buy Gift Cards — Support the Knights
