KOVAR Update.

We raised \$400 over the holiday period by collecting outside the ABC stores on Christmas and Hew Year's Eve. Thanks to Mrs. Nancy Rosenkranz, Bill Ward and Jim Witek for their efforts. Thus far we have raised \$1,709 towards our goal of \$26,246. For those who desire to contribute or help contact Tim Tilson. Remember our big KOVAR fund raising activity is April 24-27. Plan to help collect with the Knights of Virginia primary charity.

Mid-Fraternal Year Budget Report

The income side of the budget showed that our income was \$16,724 or \$3,515 below our projected income of \$20,280. This was primarily due to the fact that we did not deposit \$5500 in dues income that was received before the end of the calendar year. We had budgeted \$5100 to be deposited prior to the end of the year. So in reality we were pretty much on track in our dues income projection. Our Fund raising income was \$13,740 which was about what we had budgeted.

The expense side of the budget showed that we expended \$14, 515, which was \$1,310 below expense projection of \$15,817. In our charitable programs we expended \$400 on Feed the Homeless, Thanksgiving Baskets in addition to the baskets provide by Council members we spent \$1130 but received \$752 in Cash donations to net out a Council expenditure of \$378, Christmas Baskets we spent \$680 but received a \$100 donation to net out a Council expenditure of \$580. Outright charitable donations amounted to \$662.

The bottom line for the first half of the Council Fraternal year was forecasted to be in the black by \$4,463 instead we were in the black by \$2,213. In the second half of the Council Year our fund raising programs are minimal and our budgeted expense projection is quite high, therefore end Frat Year expected budget shortfall of \$2,200 still looks probable.

Christmas Tree Sales Wrap Up

A hearty thanks to everyone for their excellent work selling trees through the snow, rain and cold weather. It was another marvelous year with the sales. Again we ordered 510 trees and received 518 [Moose's generosity]. We sold 477 trees . . . the guy running the lot purchased too many small trees . . . that will change next year. Now the numbers . . . We made about \$7000.00 [one bill for the removal of the trailer Is pending]... total sales were \$19,860.00. The high team for total sales was the Grey Gost [God's Olde Sacred Trust] with 82 trees sold and \$3,398.00 received. The top teams for the other shifts were Team 10 with 57 trees sold and \$2,429. 00 in sales with Teams 1 and 4 splitting the total trees sold and moneys collected: Team 4: 51 & \$ 2,367.00 and Team 1; 53 & \$2,312.00 [something about a missing tree here]. Single shift stat's go to Team 9 with 32 trees and \$1,360.00 and Team 10 with 25 trees and \$1,175.00. Next year taller trees will be ordered, since, there was a great demand for them. Again, THANKS to everyone who helped! A Special thanks to Larry Gottschalk for all the effort and time put in coordinating and operating this major fund raiser. Larry was selected by the Grand Knight as the "Knight of the Month" for December for his outstanding work and effort.

Beneficiaries...Who Do You Love?

It will soon be Valentine's Day. Do you know who the beneficiary is on your life insurance policy? It would be a wise idea to find out – and update your beneficiary if necessary. As your K of C agent, I can help you do that.

Why is this important? A life insurance policy protects the financial status of another person – or people - in the event of your death. Through a beneficiary designation, <u>you</u> determine just who that should be.

When you purchase a K of C insurance policy, you must select a primary beneficiary - at a minimum. You don't have to name a contingent beneficiary – also known as a "secondary beneficiary." However, it's always a wise move because you might outlive your primary beneficiary. A contingent beneficiary (also known as a "secondary" beneficiary) is the person designated to receive life insurance policy proceeds if the primary beneficiary dies.

You should be as specific as possible in wording your beneficiary designation. By naming your wife, daughter, son, etc., as beneficiary, you make sure that the life insurance proceeds will be available in a timely manner to them.

Your life situation will undoubtedly change over time. Plan to update your declared beneficiaries periodically. Otherwise, the K of C will have no way of knowing what your intentions are at each stage of your life.

Changing your beneficiary is fairly simple. You just need to fill out a change of beneficiary form (#113A) for each policy you want to change. I can provide you with these forms – and I will help you to fill them out. I can also help you with beneficiary designations for any life insurance policy you hold – regardless of the company that issued it. Give me a call. I'm at your service.




