Grand Knight's Message:

Brothers,

Typically, I use the Grand Knight's Report to reflect on the Council's accomplishments and praise the members for all their hard work. Unfortunately, I must take a different approach this month and share with all a concern. I ask that all read this carefully and give the concerns their due attention.

For nearly 30 years, Fr Diamond Council has met at St Leo's at the pleasure of the Pastor. We have maintained a very positive relationship with Msgr Hannan, Fr Avella, and Fr Kelly. We have been truly blessed with the use of Providence Hall, and have always appreciated the generosity of the Pastor in regards to this. However, there are concerns about our treatment of the parish grounds and property, and at this time, those concerns need to be addressed in an effort to maintain a mutual respect and appreciation with the parish.

I begin by touching on parking issues. There is a serious concern about vehicles being driven and parked on the grass next to the Hall. Doing this leads to killing the grass as well as developing ruts in the lawn. I know that many of us refuse to drive or park on our lawns at home... we should afford the same courtesy to the parish! Regarding the roadway next to the ball fields, we may park along the side of the road there, but must be mindful not to block the roadway (there are signs that say "No Parking During School Hours"). The Priests depend on this lane being available to them for emergencies (imagine if a family member was in need of a Priest, but he could not get to the hospital because he was blocked from getting out!).

While we manage and maintain Providence Hall, we must keep in mind that it belongs to the parish, and the parish pays for a major portion of the utilities. As such, we must treat it with the utmost respect. Recently, after an activity in the Hall, Fr Kelly found one of the front doors was left wide open. Fortunately for us, Fr Kelly came over to close it up for us.

However, this is uncalled for and should never have happened. Please be sure that if you are the last one to leave, ALL the lights (including the outside lights) are turned off and that all doors are closed tightly and locked behind you. Some of the concerns that exist include the expense of heating and lighting up the outside, the potential of animals finding their way into the Hall and causing major damage, or someone else taking advantage of our lax security.

The Boy Scouts have a requirement that they leave a place better than they find it. This can be something as simple as picking up garbage from a field or sweeping up a room that is being used for a meeting. It's not asking too much for our council (and the Knights as a whole) to adopt a similar motto. Whenever we use any of the parish's property, we must be sure to leave it in as good (if not better) condition than we found it. Often times, we have a tendency to think, "someone else will clean it up"... this is a wrong attitude to have, and has left some people in the parish resenting the Knights. Whether it's making sure the kitchen and the gym are cleaned up properly after a breakfast, or making sure tables and chairs are returned to the same set-up we found them, we must make an extra effort to clean up after ourselves.

The short of it all is that we must show that we are thankful for the generosity of the Pastor and the parishioners of St Leo's. We can do so by treating the Hall and the parish property with the same respect we would treat our own homes. Doing so will go a long way to maintaining a positive relationship with the parish as a whole. If anyone has any questions or suggestions regarding how to do this, please feel free to touch base with me.

Food Drive

Throughout the world millions of families are in need of support to meet their basic nutritional needs. Since 1990, the Members of Fr. Diamond Council have been helping to meet the needs of those less fortunate right here in our own back yard, Northern Virginia.

Since 1990, Knights have been present to receive donations at masses on the second and fourth Sunday's of each month to support the Saint Vincent DePaul Society. We collect donations of non perishable food items after all masses to provide food to the hungry on an ongoing basis throughout the year. We also collect and distribute food for the needy at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter.

Christmas Tree Sales

Last year, tree sales brought in \$9800 profit. This year they generated a profit of \$9053. About the same number of trees were sold, resulting in less income this year, however, our costs were \$1,900 higher, so, from this perspective, this year's sales were actually better than last year. The Grey Gosts, in their 30 shifts, brought in \$4,062, almost 18% of our total sales. Team 3 had the highest total team sales of \$3494, while Team 1 had the highest average, \$729.25. A Team sales analysis is posted at Providence Hall.

While the credit for these results go to the many brother Knights who made this effort so successful, the following deserve special recognition: Past Grand Knights Larry Gottschalk, Tim Tilson & Tim Hogan, previous Tree Sales Managers for their excellent ideas, suggestions and support; the Team Captains, for staffing and managing their shifts; the Grey Gosts, granddaddy of all teams and backbone of so many Fr. Diamond activities, for setting up and dismantling the lot, as well as manning the trailer, Monday through Friday, for 3 weeks; the money men, FS & PGK Paul Cooke, Treasurer Al Leightley and former FS PGK Hank Urban, Jr who handled the all-important cash flow; as well as PGK Tom Hogan, Bill Ward and Paul Cutlip for helping cover Team 1's shifts. Finally, special thanks to the wonderful people who stand beside and behind our brother knights, their wives, fiancées and children, for sharing their men's time during a busy Christmas season.

Right to Life March 2004

Over 100,000 RTL marchers got a one-day reprieve from Arctic temperatures and over twenty Knights from Father Diamond Council collected the second highest total in contributions since they began collecting in 1994. The final total for the collection effort at this year's RTL March was \$24,387.50. Total collections for the ten year period tallied a grand total of \$163,432. According to PGK Tom Hogan, RTL founder Nellie Gray was grateful for Father Diamond Council's contribution.

Mike Plumstead was the coordinator of this year's drive. Tom Hogan and Greg Skorupski worked directly with Nellie. The following Knights worked as Marshals. Mike Plumstead and Jack Cotner were announcers. Wives also joined the effort including Jamie

Coniglio, Elaine Pepin and Li Plumstead.

Meeting the collectors after the march afterwards to count the piles of money were Sal Anzalone, John Anzalone, Peggy Cooke, Marion Kuhlman, Dave Todd, Sr., and Chris Gagliano. John Judge, the Council's gourmet chef, gets a special round of applause for providing breakfast for a dozen or more students from Loyola of Chicago who drove all night to make the March. He also provided the usual warm, tasty meal for the cold, hungry collectors when they returned to the hall.

Beneficiaries...Who Do You Love?

It will soon be Valentine's Day. Do you know who the beneficiary is on your life insurance policy? It would be a wise idea to find out – and update your beneficiary if necessary. As your K of C agent, I can help you do that.

Why is this important? A life insurance policy protects the financial status of another person – or people - in the event of your death. Through a beneficiary designation, <u>you</u> determine just who that should be.

When you purchase a K of C insurance policy, you must select a primary beneficiary - at a minimum. You don't have to name a contingent beneficiary – also known as a "secondary beneficiary." However, it's always a wise move because you might outlive your primary beneficiary. A contingent beneficiary (also known as a "secondary" beneficiary) is the person designated to receive life insurance policy proceeds if the primary beneficiary dies.

You should be as specific as possible in wording your beneficiary designation. By naming your wife, daughter, son, etc., as beneficiary, you make sure that the life insurance proceeds will be available in a timely manner to them.

Your life situation will undoubtedly change over time. Plan to update your declared beneficiaries periodically. Otherwise, the K of C will have no way of knowing what your intentions are at each stage of your life.

Changing your beneficiary is fairly simple. You just need to fill out a change of beneficiary form (#113A) for each policy you want to change. I can provide you with these forms – and I will help you to fill them out. I can also help you with beneficiary designations for any life insurance policy you hold – regardless of the company that issued it. Give me a call. I'm at your service.
