My Brother Knights,

I'm writing this message in mid-January, right after our busiest month and right before the March for Life. I want to thank once again the many people that helped sell Christmas trees, assemble and deliver Christmas baskets, and attended the March for Life as marshals or marchers. I also want to thank especially everyone that keeps the council running from day to day.

Our Knight(s) and Family of the Month for December were very involved in all these activities. The Knight(s) of the Month were Jac Cerny and Herb Zimmerman, our Christmas tree chairmen. The Family of the Month was Ben and Dorothy Schaefer who were very involved in the SVDP Giving Tree and the Christmas baskets.

Our Christmas tree sales program earned around \$7,500 profit this year, thanks to all of you who helped with our largest fund raiser. And we distributed Christmas food baskets to 71 families this year. Each year I'm very proud to see how the council comes together to have so many successful programs all in one month. The Christmas Feed the Homeless program, the council Christmas dance, the food basket delivery, and the family breakfast (with Santa visit) all happened on the same weekend!

Speaking about activities, let me talk about something dear to my heart, as a Knight that has taken part in many activities, and that is: the cleaning up phase of each activity. For the most part, brother Knights will gladly come out to help set up for an activity, and there are always plenty of Knights to help with the activity itself. But sometimes it is very hard for the activity director to get help cleaning up! As the family breakfast chairman I am very grateful for Bob Bilko, Greg Hartley, and Pat Leffas who have made a habit of coming in at the end of breakfast to help clean up. I'd like

to encourage everyone to keep cleaning up in mind when you think about your Knights time budget!

Also, I'm constantly looking for ways to improve the newsletter, so if you have any ideas, send those, too!







Host Families Needed for Northern Ireland Peace **Program**

The Children's Friendship Project for Northern Ireland (CFPNI) is seeking local families to help with the peace and reconciliation effort in Northern Ireland. Please consider hosting a Protestant and Catholic youth (ages 15-18) in your home for four weeks this summer. To be eligible, families must provide a safe, neutral setting for the two teens to get to know each other, a single bedroom for them to share, and day-long adult supervision. During the teens' stay, they participate in various activities designed to build trust, encourage cooperation and break down barriers. The majority of their time is spent enjoying the host family's normal routine.

CFPNI is a non-political, non-denominational, and allvolunteer peace program aimed at building trust, understanding and friendship among the next generation of leaders in Northern Ireland, where division still exists. Be a part of this widely praised effort which has made lasting, positive change among its participants.

Fraternal Benefits Advisor's Message:

The laws and rules of our Order, as well as state (provincial) laws, specify that the Knights of Columbus may accept insurance applications from members only. As a member, you may apply for insurance on yourself, your wife and your minor children.

The Order's Board of Directors has taken action, though, to assure that a Knight's widow maintains the right to purchase additional insurance for a limited time. This can be of great benefit and comfort to those we leave behind.

This "right to apply" is available only to the widows of insured members. If a member has not availed himself of our highly rated life insurance program, or purchased an annuity or long-term care policy, this benefit is not available to his widow.

But if the member was an insured member, his widow has the right to apply for additional insurance on her life and on the life of the member's minor children. This right must be exercised within one year following the Order's receipt of proof of the insured's death.



Information:

- 1. Father Diamond Council #6292 of the Knights of Columbus will offer a \$500 four-year scholarship.
- 2. To be eligible, the student must:
 - a. Be Catholic.
 - b. Be an Eighth Grader who will enter High School as a freshman in Sep '06.
 - c. Be planning to attend a Catholic High School in the Arlington or Washington D.C. Diocese.
 - d. Be one of the following:
 - 1) Child, grandchild or dependent of a member of Council #6292 of the Knights of Columbus.
 - 2) Child of a registered parishioner of St. Leo the Great Catholic Church.
 - 3) A student at St. Leo the Great Catholic School.
- 3. The following items must accompany the completed application:
 - a. Complete school grades from 7th grade and first semester of 8th grade.
 - b. Grades from Confraternity of Christian Doctrine (CCD) are applicable.
 - c. Two letters of recommendation, one page in length from non-parents.
 - d. One page essay preferably typed. The topic of the essay is "Why would you like to pursue a Catholic High School education." "What impact do you believe this education will have on your future?"
 - e. Sections II & III of the application should be completed using a "bullet' format i.e.
 - Member of the Science Club for two years.
 - Played tuba in School Band for three years.
 - Elected President of computer club.
 - Earned a Brown Belt in karate.
 - Achieved Life Scout in the Boy Scouts.

- 4. Completed applications are due February 17, 2006 to Mr. Tim Tilson at 3208 Traveler St. Fairfax VA 22030 (703-273-9436)/email at HMSLYDIA@msn.com), or may be dropped off at the St. Leo's rectory.
- 5. A five-member board consisting of members of Council #6292 will evaluate applications. Each applicant will be evaluated in the following areas:

Extracurricular School Activities	30 pts
Extracurricular Civic/Religious/Athletic Activities	30 pts
Academics	30 pts
Letters of Recommendation	5 pts
Essay	5 pts

Each member of the board may award up to the number of points indicated in each category to each applicant. Each applicant's score will be then averaged and compiled. The applicant with the highest score will be awarded the scholarship.

- 6. Winners will be notified in mid-April.
- 7. To retain the scholarship, the student must maintain a 2.5 cumulative Grade Point Average (on a 4.0 scale) and be recommended by his/her school.
