A couple of officers and I attended the Mid-Year State Meeting which was changed to a 100% virtual affair due to the threat of more snow on the evening of Feb. 7 and the still-fresh memory of the prior traffic snarl on I-95 after that earlier snow storm, in addition to other concerns.

The mid-year council audit was conducted on Jan. 10<sup>th</sup>, without issue. Thanks go to Treasurer Bill Lane for his orderly bookkeeping, and to our Trustees Dan O'Malley, Gib Flodine, and Mark Woznak who examined his handiwork.

We were very happy to have our parish priests attend our Family Breakfast on Jan. 16<sup>th</sup>. Parish Administrator Fr. Juan Puigbo also introduced his visiting sister to those present at the seating that followed the 9:00 Mass. Thanks go to Pat McGuire and his team who were the first to implement the new reduced menu.

Several of our council's Knights were joined by their family along with a faculty member and students from St. Paul VI Catholic High School for the March for Life in Washington, DC. They all served as march marshals/collectors of cash contributions offered by the marchers. Our heartfelt thanks goes out to them all after enduring hours in the frigid temperatures that day (mid-20s!). Thanks also to our chairman of this event, Mike Plumstead, to Pat McGuire for serving up a delicious spaghetti lunch afterwards, and to Al Leightly and Don Kehoe for organizing the volunteer money counters. It all went like clockwork due to the experienced hands involved.

On Jan. 22<sup>nd</sup>, a half-dozen Knights graciously volunteered on short notice to assist the SLSM food pantry with their scheduled food distribution. They helped the pantry staff move the food out to the curbside where it was loaded into clients' vehicles, while one Knight and his wife made a couple home deliveries. Thank you goes to all those who volunteered at this event to help alleviate food insecurity.

That same Saturday saw the preparation of over 100 potpies for a KOVAR fundraiser. This required a small army of volunteers, all of whom were well organized overall by KOVAR Chairman Gib Flodine, and by Julie Clinch in the kitchen. All of the potpies were sold as of this writing, testament to their high quality and perhaps to the cold snap which made them an appealing hot meal option. Thanks to all who made this possible!

We look ahead to hosting a District Basketball Free-Throw challenge on Saturday, Feb. 12<sup>th</sup> (boasting more adult age categories) and to Night of Magic on the following Saturday, Feb. 19<sup>th</sup>. # **Motion for By-law Change**

Section 7 of by laws (currently) reads

"The council shall retain the building fund and devote 10% of the fundraising net income, not otherwise dedicate to a specific purpose as approved by vote of the council in advance, from activities to be deposited into the fund. The wardens fund is exempt from the donation of the building fund."

New Section 8 to read from motion made

"The council shall rename the building fund to be known as an 'Emergency Fund'. This fund shall be used in extreme local emergencies i.e. local catastrophes, major building project to Providence Hall, and in case general fund shall become depleted. All aspects of the building fund revenues continue as written in section 7"for the Emergency Fund."




# Giant and Safeway Food Cards Buy Food - Buy Gift Cards — Support the Knights
