- 6. Trim down your high interest debt as fast as possible.


 Would you have bought that \$1,000 big-screen TV if the price were \$1,180? That's what you'd pay if you added the 18 percent annual interest charged on a store credit card. Even if you're loath to tap your savings account, you'll come out ahead by using it to liquidate a high-interest debt that's been hanging around for months...if not years.

Be prepared for unexpected expenditures. When these occur, it certainly helps to have some money in reserve. Some examples: might include a tax bill, vehicle repairs or purchases, moving costs, and unanticipated home repairs.


