RIGHT TO LIFE MARCH 2008

Fr. Diamond Council again this year will participate as Marshals at the annual Right to Life March in the District on Tuesday January 22, 2008. The Knights of Columbus Councils in the Washington Metro area provide Marshals for the March. They provide a variety of support services that range from crowd control to collecting money. Before 1994 our Council unloaded buses at the Ellipse or parked the buses at RFK Stadium. Since 1994 our Council has been collecting money in the line of March on Constitution Avenue. All money collected goes directly to the National Right to Life Committee to help defray the cost of the March.

Last year our Council had about 22 Brother Knights and other family members in the collection effort which also included Dennis Riley our Fraternal Benefits Advisor. As a result of this good turnout we collected a record \$25,890 our previous high was \$24,534 in 2004. Our first effort in 1994 netted \$1,855. Our records show that since we started collecting at the March we have collected a total of \$200,321 to help defray the expenses of the Marches.

We again this year have been asked to continue this very successful collection effort. Our success is determined by the number of Council members and members of their families that we can gather to carry out this most important role. The March starts at Noon and it normally takes about an hour for the Marchers to pass by our collection site where we stand in the line of March wearing white jackets and RTL Marshal Ball Caps and do our collection. The March starts on 7th St this year and we will collect in front of the Art Museum on Constitution.

We normally meet at the Hall and proceed as a group via Cue Bus and Metro to the collection site, some folks meet us at that location. We then gather at the Hall after the March and count the funds and prepare it for deposit.

Mike Plumstead and Greg Skorupski are our coordinators this year, if you can help please contact Mike ASAP at 703 250 2367 or Email at m.plumstead@cox.net because he has to submit your names to the DC Police to get solicitation permits for each individual. Again the more folks we can get to help the greater is our success, let's see if we can set a new record again this year.
