Thanks to everyone who helped with tree sales this year. We received 421 trees and sold all but around 10 when we closed the lot on Sunday 18 Dec. We announced at 1:00 pm Mass then that the trees were free and most were gone by the next day. The rest grew feet and were gone in another day or two. Team 10 had the single highest shift with 40 trees sold on Sunday 4 Dec from 1200-300. Overall Team 11 (the afternoon shift) sold 77 with team 10 in second place with 54. In 3rd place was Team 5 with 48.

David Frazier, Steve Rodgers, Pat Dunne and Team I, Roger Rosenberger and Team 9 all helped take down and move the materials back to the storage area. Volunteers needed to collect donations for the March for Life 2023

The March for Life gets underway this year on Friday, January 20, 2023. The Virginia Knights offer support services as marshals who help with everything from crowd control to collecting money.

Father Diamond Council has collected money for the March since 1994. All the collected money goes to the National Right to Life Committee to help defray the cost of the March. We've been asked to help again in this effort and are looking for volunteers to collect money at the March and to count the money once it is returned to Providence Hall after the March.

We need your help because the more collectors we have the more money we collect. When we have over 20 collect<mark>ors, we</mark>

We ask volunteers to get to Providence Hall at 10:00 AM on Friday, January 20th to pick up Marshal jackets and hats. We'll rent a bus again this year and leave Providence Hall as a group at 10:30 AM. We ask for a \$10 donation for the bus transportation. Students ride free. We also ask for a 2\$ tip for the driver from each bus rider.

The bus will arrive in DC before noon as DC police will close the area off before the march starts on 7th and Constitution Ave. Everyone will have some time to eat lunch and begin collecting at 1:00 PM. After the last of the marchers pass through our area, we will pick up our gear and return to Providence Hall by 4:00 PM for some post March snacks and fellowship. We've had many family participants over the years so if you have wives, teenage kids, or grandkids bring them along.


