Worthy Brother Knights,



The March for Life gets underway this year on Friday, January 19, 2024. The Virginia Knights offer support services as marshals who help with everything from crowd control, assisting the participants, and logistics.

Since 1994, Father Diamond Council has collected money for the March. All the collected money goes to the National Right to Life Committee to help defray the cost of the March. We've been asked to help again in this effort and are looking for volunteers to collect money at the March and to count the money once it is returned to Providence Hall after the March.

Volunteers who wish to assist in collecting donations need to meet at Providence Hall at 10:00 AM on Friday, January 19th. We will pack our gear and leave Providence Hall in a chartered bus as a group at 10:30 AM. We ask for a \$10 donation for the bus transportation. Students ride free. We also ask for a \$2 tip for the driver from each bus rider.

The bus will arrive in DC before noon as DC police will close the area off before the march. Everyone will have some time to eat lunch and begin collecting at 1:00 PM. After the last of the marchers pass through our area, we will pick up our gear and return to Providence Hall by 4:00 PM for some post march snacks and fellowship.

We've had many family participants over the years so if you have wives, teenage kids, or grandkids bring them along. Whenever you march yourself or help collect money with our council. As March for Life president Jeanne Mancini said about the Knights of Columbus' participation, without the K of C "there would be no March for Life."
