Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work

VIRTUS Training Tuesday, July 11 at 7:00 PM

Our Chaplain, Deacon Marques Silva has agreed to provide VIRTUS training to any Brother Knight who wishes to participate in any events that involve youth in our community. VIRTUS is a program created by the National Catholic Risk Retention Group in the United States with a "Protecting God's Children" component that combats sexual abuse of children in the Church. It is currently in use in over 80 dioceses in the United States including the Arlington Diocese. As Knights, we are highly supportive of our Bishops and also very concerned for the wellbeing of our children. This will be an outstanding educational experience for everyone.

The latin word *virtus* was used to describe a range of virtues. It was often divided into different qualities including *prudentia* (prudence), *iustitia* (justice), *temperantia* (temperance, self-control), and *fortitudo* (courage). This division of virtue as a whole into cardinal virtues is today classified as virtue ethics.

We are hoping that many of our council will take advantage of this opportunity to get this training. Other councils have been invited to join us as well.
