Grand Knight's Message:

My Brother Knights,

I am pleased and honored to assume the position of Grand Knight of Father Diamond Council. I thank all of you for trusting me with this duty and I hope to show myself worthy of the honor. When I think of my fellow council members - stalwart Knights all – I know that we will have another wonderful year of supporting the Church, growing in our faith, and performing charitable works.

This month I want to spotlight a program that epitomizes what our council is about. Every month we gather near Fairfax's abortion facility at Rt. 123 and Eaton Place to recite the Rosary in defense of life. We are right across from the Best Western hotel. We gather at 8:00 AM and recite all 4 decades of the Rosary. This prayer is for an end to abortion, for support for life in all its stages, to support women in crisis pregnancies who may be considering abortion but in any case need our support, to pray for the unborn victims of abortion, and to pray for their mothers who have been forever changed by their choices.

This year we are changing the Rosary program to the 2nd Saturday of the month, at 8:00 AM. This is a change from the 3rd Saturday, which we have done in the past, to avoid having two early morning programs on the same weekend (the Family Breakfast is the 3rd Sunday of the month). I invite all council members to join myself and the Deputy Grand Knight, Brother Bill Ward, for this wonderful program.

That said, the 2nd Saturday in July is July 9th, the State Quarterly Meeting, so neither Bill nor I will be able to attend the July Rosary. I look for a great showing nonetheless!

We are starting two new programs this year. On the 1st Sunday of the month we will serve coffee & donuts in Providence Hall after the 11:00 AM Mass. This program accompanies the Family Breakfast on the 3rd Sunday, and reaches the 11:00 AM Mass which is very well attended. Since we don't serve the Family Breakfast after the 11:00 AM Mass, this is a good way to get to know (and recruit!) parishioners we might not otherwise see on a regular basis.

The other new program is to help with Bingo at the Fairfax Nursing Center. This is a low manpower event and a great way to brighten the lives of the Nursing Center residents. We are shooting for the 2nd Monday of each month, starting at 6:45 PM and wrapping up about 9:00 PM. Our council will have a great year, and the more that each of you – each one individually – can be involved, the better it will be. I ask each of you to adopt a program to help out with, and to ask one fellow Catholic to join this fine order.

Nursing Home Bingo





Did You Know?

Father McGivney Guild

Father Michael J. McGivney was a 29-year-old assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church in New Haven, Conn., when he founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882. Father McGivney's holiness, devotion to priestly ministry and work to protect family life provide a powerful spiritual influence for Knights, their family members and a growing number of other Catholics.

Father McGivney's cause for canonization was opened in 1997 by then Archbishop Daniel A. Cronin of Hartford, Conn. Its diocesan phase has been completed. The Congregation for the Causes of Saints at the Vatican is currently reviewing Father McGivney's life and works and investigating two reported miracles attributed to his intercession.



The Knights of Columbus has established the Father Michael J. McGivney Guild to provide people with information about his life, works and spirituality.

The Father Michael J. McGivney Guild serves as a source for information about the life, works and spirituality of Father McGivney. The Guild distributes informational materials about him, receives reports of favors granted through his intercession and oversees the distribution of relics. Guild members receive regular updates on the progress of Father McGivney's cause for canonization and are invited to participate in promoting devotion to this Servant of God. Members of the Knights of Columbus are not automatically Guild members and must elect to join the Guild. The Father Michael J. 
