Knight of the Year - Hank Urban

The Knight of the year has served as a pillar of the Council as well as St. Leo's parish for over 30 years.

Many of you would probably be interested in the history of this Knight as it is not only very interesting, but it helps us understand why he is such a giving Knight.

He entered the U.S. Navy on March 5, 1943 at the age of 17 and retired on March 1, 1974 just three days shy of 31 years. During his time in the military this Knight accumulated over 6,000 flight hours in 25 different models of planes. He made 21 water landings in a seaplane, 700 carrier landings on 13 different ships, survived three major plane crashes and flew 150 combat sorties.

During his Naval career the nominee was awarded the Legion of Merit, Silver Star, Meritorious Service Medal, Bronze Star, six Distinguished Flying Crosses, Eleven Air Medals, and four Navy Commendation Medals. He was also the recipient of the China Service Medal and various World War II, Korean, Vietnam and Cold War service ribbons.

In November of 1948 this Knight and 40

plus shipmates had an audience with Pope Pius XII at Castel Gondolfo. He considers this as one of the high points of his life.

This Knight and his wife of 58 years have seven children who have provided them with 21 grandchildren.

As a member of o

ur Council, he has served as our Treasurer for 23 years; he has led the Finance Committee for 23 years, and has served as a Trustee in the past as well as currently serving a two year term as Trustee. He represents our Council and proudly wears his KofC badge as an Usher.

Every year he works all 4 days of KOVAR at the hall as the financial comptroller.

This Knight helps prepare the food the day before our monthly family breakfast, transports all necessary supplies over to the school gym, and helps during the breakfast. He works with the Parish Picnic Committee to ensure all supplies ore ordered and in place ready for food preparation.

Our Knight of the year is the leader of the Grey Ghosts, and the un-official historian



for our council, keeping voluminous records of the activities over the years providing reference for current and future officers and members.

All of the members of the Council have contact with this Knight as he maintains the extensive email distribution list and communication for the Council. He sends out Welcoming emails to new members, including transfer memberships, detailing when meetings are, and pertinent contact information. He also sends out fraternal notices when there is an illness or death within the Council family, as well as send-

ing information about upcoming events. He is also our mechanic, electrician, carpenter, and overall handyman. We don't know how we would manage without him!


