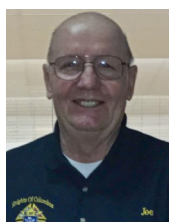

An emphatic, special "thank you" is offered to **Joe Paratore**, who, month after month, weaves the numerous reports of our achievements and activities, our photos and announcements into the scintillating tapestry that we know as **The Lookout**. Before I close, I wish to share with you two proclivities: "**Aloha Oe**," and **Saint Maxmilian Kolbe**.



Robert E. Lee Prewitt (Montgomery Clift) was the memorable bugler who so beautifully played "Taps" in honor of his friend, Maggio (Frank Sinatra) in *From Here to Eternity*; setting Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, December, 1941. "**Aloha Oe**" was the haunting Hawaiian melody at the very end of the film. I am certain that you've heard it many times before in relation to Hawaiian themes. But the one



time that I especially remember was at a retirement ceremony for the First Sergeant of "Company B," 1st Battalion 27th Infantry, "Wolfhounds." As the old "top sergeant" trooped

the lines for the last time, drums, accompanied by the bugle, reverently rolled, accentuating the awesome emotions of "**Aloha Oe**," and, thus, softly enchanting the entire assembly. You see, the "Wolfhounds" (were Christened same by a Communist general in 1918 during the Russian Civil War – "They pursued us like Wolfhounds.") later, during the Korean Conflict, collected money to start a Catholic orphanage in Osaka, Japan. To this day, on every occasion that the 27th Infantry celebrates its "Organization Day" in Hawaii, two orphans from Osaka take the review. Of course, always with them is their wolfhound mascot, "Kolchak," named after a White Russian admiral. At one of the long past celebrations, actress, Shirley Temple (as the little girl star) was the guest of honor! Thus, **Wolfhounds ("Nec Aspera Terant! No Fear on Earth!")**, the **Infantry**, care for orphans in the spirit of **Father Michael J. McGivney! Aloha Oe!**

Maxmilian Kolbe's feast day is August 14. Because I admire his selfless courage so much, I just want to take advantage of this opportunity to share my appreciation of his virtue and dedication to life and Our Blessed Lord with you. The Committee met regularly and they had a near flawless execution with minor surprises such as a last minute substitute for one of the comedians. The committee tried a new approach for advertising using social media (Facebook) and its event promotion features along with an online Web Page where interested parties could purchase tickets in advance through the convenience of paying online with their credit card. Both approaches were very successful helping us sell tickets for an event held on Memorial Day weekend (a time when many people are out of town).

Over 140 people attended the event and we were able to raise over \$6,000 for our scholarships and charities. Silent Auction sales accounted for \$4,800 of that total. This year we were able to institute credit card payments and we believe that encouraged more people to bid and also higher bid amounts.

The Door Prize committee had 25 different door prizes with values from \$20 to \$100 each. There were 26 Silent Auction items offered at a wide range of values which offered a lot of choices for the participants.

Open Letter to the Father Diamond Council #6292

Dear Grand Knight Joe and Brothers of Council #6292,

I want to thank you for coming out to visit the Marroquin family on Thursday. As you saw for yourself, she is making a fine recovery now. She is still not out of the woods but she is well on her way.

Your support and the support of the Knights of Columbus Council #6292 made a real difference in the Marroquin family's life. In November of 2017 the family was facing eviction from their home. At that point in their lives, Jose could not work because he had a new baby to take care of. Rosario had just delivered her son, was suffering from multiple operations, and was near death. The family was out of food, out of money, and out of options. Can you imagine what would have happened to Rosario and her baby if they had been evicted at that point? She would have been forced to recover sleeping on some dirty homeless shelter mattress, or living out of their car, or worse. The only resource Rosario had left at that point was the most powerful. She was praying the rosary (her namesake) for help. And when help came, it came from the men of Council #6292. Your quick response as Grand Knight of Council #6292 pulled together the combination of talented men who knew how to muster the right resources so that help came at just the right moment. We could not have asked for a better response from the men of your council for which you should be very proud.



As we were driving to the Marroquin's home that day, we passed the site of the old abortion clinic on our way. You pointed it out to me and said how you used to pray the rosary there to end abortion and now it was closed down. Little did you know that your prayers there were preparing you for your correct response to Rosario's situation when you would have the opportunity as Grand Knight. The doctors had told Rosario that she should have an abortion to save her own life. They wanted her to trade her child's life for a smooth uncomplicated operation on her. But she refused. She said, "I will take the chance on my life – just make sure my child lives". She put her life on the line for our beliefs, and your Council's quick response allowed both to live.

By taking time, visiting, and breaking bread with them you showed that Knights of Columbus truly care for the less fortunate and that you're willing to back up that claim with action. I will always remember the words you said to Rosario on our departure: That it was "an honor for you to meet her".

Thank you for being the kind, gentle person you are. The world is a better place because you are in it. You are truly a Grand, Knight.

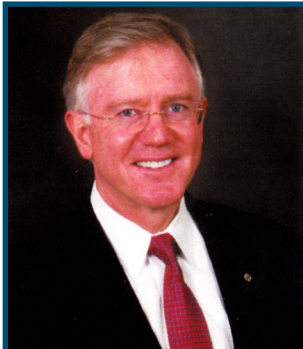
