Grand Knight's Message:

Brothers,

As we begin the Lenten Season, we should take a moment to reflect on the importance of this time of year. The Church gives us this season, symbolic of Christ in the desert, to reflect on our sinfulness and mortality, as well as to prepare ourselves for Holy Week and the events of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord. We give up something we enjoy as a form of a fast; we participate in additional services in the church as a form of prayer; and we give graciously of ourselves (here in the Diocese of Arlington, to the Bishop's Lenten Appeal) as a form of almsgiving. Let us make good use of the added opportunities to find reconciliation thru the Sacrament of Confession, as well as the added opportunities to receive our Lord, Body and Soul, into our being thru more frequent reception of the Blessed Sacrament.

During these past two month, our Council has been very active in many areas, and I'd like to take a moment and thank all those who assisted with them. We hosted a Third Degree Exemplification on January 17, participated in the annual March for Life on January 22, served breakfast to the Scouts on February 1, held a blood drive on February 8, hosted a Valentine Dinner-Dance on February 14, and served breakfast for the parish on February 15. 


