Our collection effort during the Right to Life March was a huge success because of the nice turnout of 25 Brother Knights and 3 spouses to help. The collection netted a record \$25,890 and a \$50 Canadian Dollar. This was the 14th year that we have been collecting; this income exceeded the previous largest total by about \$1,000 which was in 2002. The effort was headed up by Mike Plumstead. [Thanks also to] Greg Skorupski who again this year drove Nellie Gray, the President of the March for Life, from the March to the Supreme Court Building and to Tom Hogan who is involved with the Virginia Knights of Columbus effort supporting the March. Also thanks to Mary Lou Gross, Ben Schaefer and Carlos Jaramillo who came after the March to help Hank Urban and a lot of the Collectors to count the monies. A huge thanks to all who participated in this most successful effort to collect and count the monies which goes to help pay for this annual Right to Life March, a job well done.

Brothers Salvatore (Sal) Anzalone, Adelard Brault, Sr. and Millard Teopaco all passed away during the month of February and our prayers go out to their families. Council Audit

Semi-annual Audits of the Warden, Scrip and Council Funds were conducted by the Council's Trustee's for the period of July 1 to December 31, 2006.. Records of all these activities were scrutinized and were in balance. The Wardens records showed a profit of \$197.60 for the period which was transferred to the Financial Secretary. It was noted that in several activities the Chairman of an activity purchased supplies without checking with the Warden to see if he could furnish some of the items needed. The activity's surplus supply was sold back to the Warden who already had an excess of those supplies. It is recommended that activity Chairmen coordinate their purchases with the Warden. A quick inventory of the Wardens supplies revealed that as the result of buy backs he had about 5 cases each of Sprite and Regular Cokes which is in excess of the stock levels needed to run his activity.

A physical count of the scrip was done and balanced with the records of the scrip manager and the financial folks. With some minor adjustments the records were balanced. Scrip usage during this period was \$38,570, sales were \$35,340 council usage was \$3230 mostly for Thanksgiving and Christmas basket programs. This was the first audit period in which the school was involved with the sales of scrip their sales amounted to \$13,020 of the total sales. The school receives 30% of the profits of the sales up to \$40,000 and will then receive 50% of the profits over \$40,000. Sales during this period showed a nice increase over the last two audit periods which were \$19,765 and \$23,740 respectively.

The Council's financial books were reviewed and were in balance. The funds are well managed and the financial well being of the Council is healthy. The net worth of the Council is \$152,003.10. The operating fund is at \$38,353 of which \$3,892 is in checking and the remainder in interest bearing CD's. The Building Fund is currently at \$103,336 and the Right to Life account has \$3,862 both accounts are invested in CD's.

Our current membership is 402 as compared to 422 at the end of the last audit period. 17 members were dropped from our rolls because of unpaid dues. This reduced our unpaid dues line item from \$4,405 to \$1,882 which was still overdue by 40 members at the end of December.
