KOVAR 2012 – (please note the date change)

In 1971, the Virginia State Council formed the program known as KOVAR. KOVAR originally stood for Knights of Virginia Assisting the Retarded and uses the specially wrapped Tootsie Roll as a reward to those who contribute to the drive that assists people with intellectual disabilities. Since the collections began in 1972, more than \$13 million in Grants and Group Home Loans have been awarded to over 250 organizations including the Special Olympics.

Father Diamond Council first participated in KOVAR in 1975. We have collected over \$550,000 of that total which is remarkable considering there are 140 Councils in Virginia. The campaign was originally scheduled to conduct the drive in mid-April 2012. However, due to the availability of certain stores, the drive has been changed to March 22-25. Sources toward our goal include contributions to KOVAR through the annual *United Way, Combined Federal Campaign and Combined Virginia Campaigns*. KOVAR's main source of income is from Brothers Knights who stand three-hour shifts at various stores in the area. 

Cover two people with one policy

In this month's article, I want to discuss a type of life insurance product with which you might not be familiar.
