## **Home for Christmas Project**

Thelma Billy, wife of PGK George Billy, and Zenaida Phillips, wife of Robert Phillips, recently completed their journey to the Philippines to build homes for people who lost theirs last October due to a 6.5 magnitude earthquake in Mindanao. They held a fundraiser in early January, and then travelled to the Philippines in late January to start the reconstruction. They went to a remote mountainous area - Baranguay Buenavida, Makilala, Cotabato province, Mindanao where families live who work on nearby rubber plantations- a 45 minutes journey from Makilala via dirt road to the mountain top.

They were able to complete 11 homes with construction ongoing for four more with the funds available from generous donors (many from the council). The homes are simple bahay-kubos that allowed the families to move from the tents they were living under. Below are some pictures of the homes taken during the house blessings in February. See the happy faces of the recipient families! Members from local KofC councils in Makilala and Kidapawan attended the house blessings.

There is still a great need to build additional homes if more donations are received. Zenaida's brother Alphonso (a former seminarian) lives nearby in Makilala and will supervise the construction.

Also, through generous donations from Fr. Diamond Council and Fr. Malloy Assembly reconstruction of the chapel is wellunderway and the roof was put up last week. They are trying to complete it before the start of the rainy season. Donations are still needed to complete the walls surrounding the sanctuary. This is a missionary chapel, and Masses are celebrated on Tuesday's and Sunday's.
