Grand Knight's Message:

SOLIDARITY WITH OUR PRIESTS This is stretched on a banner across the front of Providence Hall and is an integral portion of the Knight's mission. When Fr. Our principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism and defense of the priesthood are derived from the truths of religion and under gird our every activity.' With the current challenges in the Church our total support of our Priest's and the Church is required. Since most of the world does not understand Catholicism, it is up to us to show them what we stand for. With the commencement of the church renovations the Masses have been moved to the school gym. With that the council has assumed responsibility for setting up and breaking down the 700 chairs. As noted last month the Christmas Trees teams have been asked to complete this task; you have asked to help once every eleven weeks. When your team's rotation comes up please try to

help, since, it takes many people to expedite the set up and break down. Now that the lay out is set it takes about 30 minutes to set up [at 3:00 PM on Sat] and about 20 to break down after the 6:30 PM Mass on Sunday. Remember this is a council function in support of our host parish St. Leo's. We've given our financial support, now lets give our muscle support.

As mentioned last month Bill Jayne has assumed the usher leadership for the parish and is doing a wonderful job of coordinating the requirements for the Masses. There are still a number of openings and Bill would appreciate additional volunteers to assist.

With the beginning of the new year the council dues were due. Unfortunately, every year we have a few Knights that may have forgotten to pay. Again, these finance much of the administrative costs of the council. This year we have approximately 40 knights that are up to two years in arrears. This forces us to suspend these Knights due to non-payment. This is not something we want or like to do, but must do to maintain a viable council. The Easter bunny arrived and deposited 1900 eggs on the front lawn of the church and not even a steady rain could slow down the kids. Thanks to Ben Stack for coordinating the depositing of the eggs and Bill Ward for becoming the Bunny for a day. And a special thanks to the Leightley family for stuffing all the eggs. There were a lot of very happy and smiling kids. And Bill also coordinated the assembly and distribution of the Easter Baskets for those in our community that need them. This was another very successful event.

Then several Knights helped with the ushering at both the Confirmation and First Communion Masses for our children. Again, it went very well. Then we moved the parish breakfast to the hall, since, the gym was being used for Mass. After a little memory recall from years ago when the breakfast was held at the hall, we got it together and had a successful event. Since, we only have one oven, the menu was reduced . . . the potatoes and French toast were dropped. With our new grill and warming

oven the breakfast should be much easier next month. Come out next month and have a delicious meal.


