Grand Knight's Message:

My Brother Knights,

I write this message on April 9. March was a big month for family and food-oriented activities, with the St. Patrick's Day Party, the Night of Magic, the Columbiettes Soup Supper, and the Lenten Fish Bake. Thanks to all who made these activities so successful. This is the first year I attended the St. Patrick's Day party, and I actually enjoyed it very much, especially the Irish dancing. The Night of Magic went very well, not least because the magicians went to a one long set strategy, versus two shorter sets with an intermission as in past years; so the show lasted 75 minutes, just the right time to keep the kids' attention. I couldn't actually attend the soup supper but our Deputy Grand Knight assures me everything was delicious. I really enjoyed the cheese pizza at the Fish Bake – I'd already had fish for lunch!

March 1 was the first day of Lent this year. I write this message at the start of Holy Week. I struggled with Lent this year, especially at the start. It was very hard to orient myself towards God away from the world. But I kept attending Mass every weekday morning, and I continued my daily Bible and Catechism readings (my New Year's Resolution was to read the entire Bible and Catechism this year). And I changed part of my study at home to be a shrine to Our Lady. So far I just have a statue, icons and statues, and some fresh flowers. But having it there is a great comfort to me. I encourage all of you to take advantage of the tremendous wealth of spiritual practice and knowledge available to you! St. Leo's holds Mass twice a day on weekdays – 3 times during Lent and Advent. The Bible is available in every bookstore and for every computer, even many cell phones! If constant prayer, Mass attendance, and spiritual reading can change my life then no one is beyond reach! I want to especially call out a new resource: The "Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church". In 200 pages this book answers 598 questions

about the faith, and also contains 14 images of classic Christian artwork. By repute it is more clear and concise than the Catechism itself (and obviously does not replace the richness and depth of the full Catechism).

One of our newest Knights, Patrick Reeder, came to this area from Mississippi after Hurricane Katrina. He works for a company that was able to relocate to this area. Patrick is still in contact with his old parish, "Our Lady of the Gulf" in Bay St. Louis, MS. As the name indicates the church is mere blocks from the Gulf, and was devastated by the hurricane. I would like our council to take it upon ourselves to adopt Our Lady of the Gulf parish, and to help meet their many needs by the aid of our prayers, our financial support, and our manual labor. Our Lady of the Gulf is a small slice of the ruin brought about by Katrina, but in Patrick we have a direct personal connection to this one slice. I would like each one of you to consider how Fr. 


Departing Brothers

Fraternal Benefits Advisor's Message:

The Knights of Columbus policy on replacing existing life insurance is as follows: "The Order does not condone the practice of soliciting replacement insurance or using cash values or dividends of existing policies to finance new business. In most cases, replacement is not to the policyholder's advantage."

The reasons for this are many. First, premiums usually increase on a new policy because it is issued at an older age. The older your are, the more expensive life insurance is.

Many times, options available under the older policy are lost and sometimes not offered under the new policy. In addition, a new "incontestability" period begins with the new contract. The Order, for example, maintains the right to contest a claim up to two years from the issue date of the policy. A new policy brings with it a new issue date, and a new "incontestability" period.


