Did you know that the U.S. Government and the Knights of Columbus are the only organizations to insure active duty military and include death in combat as an insured cause of death? Councils at the state meeting turned in a total of \$37,895 for Hurricane Katrina relief, of which \$3,750 came from our Fr. Diamond Council – thanks to all of you for your contributions.

Would you like to spruce up your home with some fine art? Do you have too many bare walls in your house? Are you looking for artistic Christmas gifts? Do you have any family pictures or snapshots that would make a great painting? If so, please attend our council Art Auction on Saturday November 19th. The Unborn Child Pain Awareness Act was read into the Senate (S.51) and the House (H.R.356) on January 25th of this year. The title is "To ensure that women seeking an abortion are fully informed regarding the pain experienced by their unborn child", and applies to women seeking abortion after 20 weeks. The EWTN Prolife Corner mentioned this bill on my drive home from work today – otherwise I wouldn't know about it. Please consider expressing your support to your elected representative.

In more local right-to-life news, the Tepeyac Family Center right here in Fairfax is having a fundraising dinner on December 3. In the words of Brother Knight Pat Leffas:

Here's a quick summary of the main points (i.e., why Tepeyac is such a good thing and so important to maintain):

- "Tepeyac is a pro-life, family focused medical center."

"Children are gifts, and therefore joys not burdens."
"Tepeyac believes that the family is the central building block of our society."

- "NO CONTRACEPTION, ABORTIONS OR ABORTION INDUCERS WILL EVER BE DISPENSED OR RECOMMENDED"

And remember, even if you can't help with Thanksgiving, we still have Christmas and then Easter baskets coming up. Stay tuned!


Crèche


