#### 2010 Thanksgiving Basket Program

Father Diamond Council is again teaming up with St Leo's SVDP to provide Holiday Food Baskets to the needy at Thanksgiving. The new procedure for distribution of Holiday Food Baskets is described in the October Council Newsletter. The council will provide SVDP \$900 in gift cards for turkeys and perishable goods for 45 Families. The food baskets will be distributed on Saturday Nov. 20th from the SVDP Pantry directly to the recipients instead of being delivered to their residences.



Traditionally, council members, individually or in groups, have provided food baskets and/or money donations for food baskets at Thanksgiving. The Council

goal is to have the membership provide at least 45 baskets. Individual members desiring to purchase a food basket can use the attached list of suggested food items as a guideline for what and how much to purchase for the baskets. These food baskets need to be delivered to SVDP Food Pantry (not Providence Hall) from 4 to 6 PM from Monday Nov. 8th thru Friday Nov. 12.

If members desire to make a donation by check in lieu of a food basket, the recommended donation is \$75 to \$100. The checks should be made out to the "Saint Vincent DePaul Society" and given to **Al Leightley, Charity Chairman, by Thursday Nov.18**<sup>th</sup> when the checks will be turned over to SVDP who will make a written acknowledgement to the donation donors.
