"Best Doctor in Town" Supports KOVAR Pays Friendly, Successful House Call To Father Diamond Council At St. Leo the Great Catholic School

"Best Doctor in Town," offering the intrigue of a Shoestring Theater production and the insight of a Ken Burns film, on Friday evening, 5 October deftly revealed the individual human and social challenges of daily life in a small, southwestern Virginia town. Accenting both humor and cynicism, this splendid drama by the Shoestring Theater Company (Founding Director, Amelia Townshend from Oakton, Virginia) was inspired by real events and personalities from the southern, rural reaches of Virginia. This production company is a 501 © 3 non-profit organization created to connect cultural themes across Virginia. They all work and volunteer in the arts and community enrichment programs. It just so happens that "The Best Doctor in Town," (and villain), Steve Palkovitz, is a Third Degree Brother Knight from Vienna, Virginia. All cast members were especially appreciative for the rehearsal opportunities in our own Providence Hall and the spacious venue of the St. Leo the Great Catholic School gym.

KOVAR, as a result of ticket sales and gifts associated with this splendid initiative, was enhanced by \$943.81. Kairos Prison Ministry Program Update From Tom Kelly

I want to thank everyone for their prayers and support of the Kairos prison ministry program. An excellent retreat at the prison was held the weekend of October 18-21. Over 100 dozen cookies made by The St. Leo's Mom Group, under the leadership of Danielle Pierson, and the support from the Father Diamond Council, were a huge success! The cookies were baked at our hall on September 23rd. Kathleen Kappes delivered to me small posters prepared by The Legion of Mary children to offer encouragement to the prisoners. I attended a Catholic Mass at the prison where the Catholic community is strong. A special thanks to all of the cookie bakers and those of you who made cards and posters for your time and effort.

Following are some of the remarks from the men participating that I was able to write down during the closing ceremony:

1) In what Spiritual condition did you arrive at Kairos?

The residents (prisoners) responded with words like "open minded, inquisitive, solitary, skeptical, curious, seeking cookies, opportunity to meet new people, lonely, uncertain, broken, holding on to the past, searching, enthusiastic wanting to be fed, seeking answers and desiring change.

2) What did you find here?

The residents responded with "I found a few more friends, fellowship, the ability to open up, opportunity, ability to be true to yourself, tranquility, peace of mind, a safe haven, support, positive environment, family, forgiveness, compassion, hope, there is something to this (Christianity), application of spiritual gifts, part of a greater community, respect and understanding of the other.

3) What are you taking with you?

Responses were "things to apply to my life, understanding how to act as a Christian, never spent this much time with God, plan to be more open, a desire to share my faith, knowledge about stepping stones towards God, wisdom, word of God, a cross as a memento, courage, patience, take action, a new view of the Word, a new outlook on life, seeds were sown here, a mustard seed of hope from which the tree of life will grow, love, desire to share my faith, good blessings.

Below are a few letters that I have recently received from prisoners that I want to share with you:

Letter #1 - Written by Eddie. Eddie expresses the struggles of the prison environment but shares the hope in the greetings of another prisoner. I've known Eddie for 15 years. He has a life sentence but remains strong in his faith.

Letter #2 - Written by Ron. Ron and I share a common bond of service to our country as career Marines. Ron practices Islam. He accepted my invitation to attend Kairos and completed the course. Now, he wants to know more about the Christian faith.

Letter #3 - Written by Les Green. Les was recently transferred to another prison. The Kairos program is not offered in this new prison, but Les is sharing the Kairos newsletters he receives with other prisoners. Praise God!

Please continue to pray for these prisoners and ask God to bless your work in support of these prisoners.
