Grand Knight's Message

James "Jim" Beauchamp, Grand Knight

Brother Knights,

I realize that November and December are busy months as we head into the hectic holiday seasons of Thanksgiving and Christmas which place so many demands on our precious time. But I do strongly suggest volunteering some of your time to one of our upcoming charitable works such as **Scouting for Food, Thanksgiving/ Christmas baskets**, or **Feed the Homeless**. We could also use all the help we

can get at our biggest fundraiser of the year – the **Christmas Tree sale**. Also don't forget the **KCIC** (Keep Christ in Christmas) card sale. This is very important also. Please read further in the newsletter for additional details about these worthy programs.

With the coming of November, of course we think of Thanksgiving – a uniquely American holiday. Below is a portion of an article I wrote about Thanksgiving nearly 20 years ago.

It's commonly believed that the first Thanksgiving in America was the harvest celebration of the early Pilgrims and Native Americans in Plymouth Massachusetts in 1621. But, did you know that a day of Thanksgiving was celebrated two years earlier in Virginia? On December 4, 1619, when a group of 38 English settlers first arrived at Berkeley Plantation, in what is now Charles City, Virginia, they formally gave thanks as required by their charter. Unfortunately, this particular Virginia colony and its thanksgiving celebration lasted for only a few years. Prior to the American Revolution, New Englanders continued to set aside a special day of thanksgiving. After the American victory over the British at Saratoga, New York, the Continental Congress proclaimed December 18, 1777 as a day of "Solemn Thanksgiving and Praise". This was the first time that all 13 colonies joined in a thanksgiving celebration. To honor the formation of the United States government, President George Washington proclaimed November 26, 1789 to be a National Day of Thanksgiving. Despite these early occurrences, by the early 19^{th} century, Thanksgiving had failed to become an annual, national tradition. A magazine editor, named Sarah Josepha Hale, spent several decades promoting the idea of setting aside a national day of giving thanks. Finally, her efforts were rewarded on October 3, 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed the last Thursday in November as a national day "of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father". After this, Thanksgiving continued to be celebrated on the last Thursday of November until the presidency of Franklin Roosevelt. In 1939. President Roosevelt moved it up to the next-to-last Thursday in November, perhaps to create a longer Christmas shopping season. This was rather controversial. Only about half the states followed Roosevelt's wishes. To settle matters, in 1941 Congress passed legislation designating the fourth

Thursday in November as Thanksgiving Day. In this way, the holiday sometimes falls on the last Thursday and other times on the next-to-last


Chancellor's Report

Chaplain's Message

Dear Brother Knights,

This Month of November begins with the great Solemnity of All Saints. A day the church remembers that, "we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses" (Heb.12:1) of men and women "from every nation, race, people, and tongue.... Who stand before the throne and before the Lamb." (Rev. 7:9) For us as Catholic men and Knights of Columbus, The So-

lemnity of All Saints is a good day to remember what the great Catholic Novelist, Leon Bloy once said, "The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint!" We are reminded that Holiness is not a spiritual luxury or exceptional way for us as Catholics. Indeed, it is the Normal goal of the Christian Life, and the only road, the only formula, the only program for abiding happiness in this life and the next. Our Mother Church reminded <mark>us of Our "U</mark>niversal Call to Holiness" in the document Lumen Gentium reminding us that "All the faithful, whatever their <mark>condition or state, are called by the Lord, each in his own way, to that perfect holiness whereby the Father Himself is per-</mark> fect." (LG 11) Let us hear again, with new urgency Our Blessed Lord's words said to us personally, "Be perfect, therefore, as your Heavenly Father is perfect." (Matthew 5:48). He has called us. He is expecting us. As we are inspired by the example of Saints like St. John Paul II, St. Thomas More, King St Louis IX, St. Louis Martin, and St loseph and reminded of Our own call to holiness I would like to extend an invitation to you as your Chaplain, I <mark>am currentl</mark>y speaking with Our Grand Knight, James Beauchamp about implementing a new ministry within the Father Diamond Council. And this ministry is meant to minister to you! The ministry is called Cor (Latin word for heart) and <mark>the mission</mark> is, "to refocus Catholic men on Jesus Christ and to form and strengthen them in faith and virtue through a brother-<mark>hood committed to pray together, to be formed in their faith, and to strengthen their bonds of brotherhood, preparing them for</mark> courageous leadership and the mission of evangelization for their families and communities." https://www.kofc.org/un/en/whowe-are/our-faith/cor.html James has introduced this ministry already, but I myself would encourage you to seriously discern coming to our future Cor gatherings once we begin. I plan to be involved In Cor as your chaplain and helping to begin this new ministry in Our Council. In the Acts of the Apostles we hear the program for holiness laid out as the early Christian communities who, "devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching (formation) and the fellowship (fraternity), to the breaking of bread (code for the mass/sacraments) and the prayers (life of prayer). (Acts 2:42) We are aiming to provide the same "devotions" for you as brother knights through Cor.

Lastly, as we enter into the month of November, the Month dedicated to praying for the Poor Souls, we remember one of the Knights pillars, "Tempus fugit. Memento mori" — "Time flies. Remember death." I would encourage you this month to spend time praying for the Poor souls in Purgatory. Maybe by praying a rosary each day throughout the month, or going to daily mass once a week, or visiting a cemetery of a loved one or a friend to pray for them (As a reminder: A plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted each and every day from November 1st to Nov 8th, to those who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed. Grant #29.1.1)

Thank you for all you do for our council, our community, and our Church! Know of my prayers for you and your families.
