Shining Armor Award

New members take an important step in becoming members of our glorious Order. There is so much the Knights can do in support of the Church. New members bring fresh insight, ideas, suggestions and this helps keep the council alive and healthy as it tries to address problems it encounters. Our Order encourages new members to become involved and even has a special program to channel and reward their efforts. To qualify for the Shining Armor Award, new knights must do the following during their first year of membership: 1) be involved in at least three council service programs; 2) attend at least three business meetings; receive their Second and Third egrees; 4) meet with their council's insurance representative; and 5) recruit at least one new member.

Stroke Screening Successful at Hall

On August 12, 2003, Father Diamond hosted a stroke detection day at the Hall conducted by LifeLine Screening. The sold-out day involved three health screenings to detect the risk of strokes, abdominal aortic aneurysm and heart disease with a separate bone density screening for osteoporosis. All involve painless, ultrasonic, noninvasive procedures, the results of which are reviewed by physic ian and reported to the individual participant for follow-up with their own doctors.

-Of the 65 people screened for Cartoid Artery Disease, 40 were in the normal range, 23 in moderate and 2 in severe with no one deemed critical.

-Of the 66 screened for peripheral arterial disease, 64 were normal, and 2 abnormal

-Of the 66 screened for abdominsl aneurysms, one was detected.

And of the 32 screened for Osteoporosis, 13 were low risk, 7 were at moderate risk and 12 were found to be at high risk.

What these numbers mean is that several individuals will have their lives extended or literally saved by these screenings. More than half of all people who suffer heart attacks have low cholesterol, don't smoke, drink or are overweight—jog every day and generally feel great. But, as doctors know, you can still have plaques in your system that are lethal. These can be detected by the above tests and medications now exist to take care of most situations. But since the testing is preventative, few insurance plans cover them.

Hawaiian Luau

Cost is \$15 per adult, \$10 per child (under 14 years), with a maximum of \$50 per family. Net profit will be directed toward the expenses of the Pro-Life Memorial. Roth IRAs: A Less Taxing Way to Save

Did you know that you can establish a Roth IRA through the Knights of Columbus? If you haven't set up a Roth IRA for this year, there's still time to take advantage of this great way to save for retirement.

You can now save up to \$3,000 per year, minus the amounts contributed to other IRAs. The limit is \$3,500 for people over 50. The total you can contribute also depends on your income, but you can do so regardless of whether you participate in a pension plan.

Although your contributions aren't deductible, the longrange benefits of a Roth IRA should be compared to those of a traditional IRA. For starters, many people earn too much for a traditional IRA to be a tax deduction. And with a Roth IRA you avoid the age-70 ¹/minimum distribution requirements that come with a traditional IRA.

You can establish a Roth IRA, and make your yearly contribution, up to the date you file your tax return for that year (excluding extensions). But annual contributions to a Roth IRA aren't required. All interest you earn is federal income tax-free, provided you withdraw your funds under certain "qualified distribution" rules.




