Grand Knight's Message:

My Brother Knights,

Hurricane Katrina brought unparalleled devastation to our country as we saw a major city completely depopulated and tens of thousands of people uprooted from their homes. Thousands of families in California, Texas, here in Virginia, and many other states have opened their homes to many refugee families. Supreme Council has pledged at least \$2.5 million in support of the hurricane relief effort. I'm glad to report that our own council is taking its part. Fr. Diamond Council is contributing \$2,500 to the relief effort, \$1,900 of which was raised at our latest council bake sale. Thanks again to Brother Knight Nelson Clinch and his wife Julie for this great event. The last I heard, the Treasurer had received over \$1,100 in individual contributions. I will take a check for the total combined amount – the \$2,500 from the council and the sum of the individual contributions given to the Treasurer - to the Virginia state meeting on October 1. Thanks to all of you for your wonderful support.

In September we completed the latest round of improvements to the Right to Life statue outside St. Leo's church. Greg Hartley, Mike Plumstead, and Steve Davis led the effort to place 100 new bricks (including bricks for Pope John Paul II and our pastor), and the bricks are now flush against the sidewalk. Please take a look at the new improved brick area and pray at this beautiful shrine to this most fundamental human right.

The Right to Life statue is a major feature in a fundraiser that I am reviving this year. The council will hold an art auction in St. Leo's school gym on Saturday, November 19th. Marlin Art (the art auction company) provided an oil painting of the statue to be part of the auction. With your participation and support, the art auction can be a major success for us this year. Even if only 80 couples participate the council stands to make about \$4,000 from this one event. I ask each and

every member and their wife or significant other to attend the event, and also to invite another couple that you would like to spend a wonderful evening with. The evening will feature music, food, door prizes, and a good time should be had by

Thanks to everyone who came to Bishop Loverde's Pro-Life Mass at St. Leo's on September 10, and to everyone that attended the Rosary immediately afterwards. The right to life is the fundamental human right and a centerpiece of the Church's teaching. Our monthly right-to-life Rosary on the second Saturday of each month may be the most visible sign of our support for life. Please come to our next Rosary, 8:00 AM on Saturday October 8, at the corner of Rt. 123 and Eaton Place in Fairfax City.

Also please continue your wonderful support for the many new and ongoing council activities. Here are just a few of them: Dave Todd and LaVerne McGrail (Brother Knight Larry McGrail's wife) are reviving the St. Leo's welcoming committee; Bill Weich and Bill Ward are distributing KOC folders, flyers, and pencils to St. Leo's school; Tim Tilson with help from most of the council ran another clockwork Parish Picnic. 



Scrip Program

The Scrip Program is a fund raiser for all of the general charitable programs of Father Diamond Council #6292. In addition, a percentage of the profits are given directly to St. Leo's Parish and goes to the general fund (so it benefits all of the church's programs, including the school).

Our council purchases gift cards or paper scrip from grocery stores at a set discount and we sell the scrip/cards at face value. People who purchase the scrip get their exact value at the store (i.e., \$100 gets you \$100 of groceries). These are extremely convenient to have in your wallet or purse and there is no "product" to purchase -- you can use the scrip with or debit/credit card cash and coupons/discounts you have are unaffected -- they are like cash at the store. These make great gifts as well, for the holidays or those kids you just sent off to school.

This is the easiest way you can help the Council raise funds. After all, everybody's gotta eat, so why not buy your groceries with Scrip?
