

SVDP and FATHER DIAMOND COUNCIL HOLIDAY BASKET REVISED PLAN FY 2010/2011

Saint Vincent De Paul (SVDP) Society, due to staff limitations and workload, has proposed a new method and process for distributing Holiday Food Baskets to the needy at Thanksgiving, Christmas and Easter. They are still requesting the support of Father Diamond Council in these efforts. The revised plan includes:

- SVDP would distribute all Holiday Food Baskets (Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter) through the normal SVDP Pantry monthly distribution process.
- Father Diamond Council general delivery support directly to the needy would still be required for delivery of the Christmas Presents to the homes from the storage area.
- Father Diamond Council will also support on a case basis Holiday Food Basket deliveries for the elderly, those lacking transportation and handicapped on request of SVDP.
- For Thanksgiving Baskets, Knights could either provide a basket of food or provide a cash donation to SVDP. The council suggested food item list can still be used for purchasing the food for the baskets. For those providing the food baskets, the Council Charity Chairman, Al Leightley, would coordinate dates/times with SVDP for delivery of the food baskets to the SVDP Pantry.
- For those making cash contributions, in lieu of providing food baskets at Thanksgiving, Father Diamond Council brothers can provide donations (suggested between \$75 and \$100 per basket) to SVDP. The donations should be in the form of a check made out to Saint Vincent DePaul Society. The checks would be submitted to Father Diamond Council Charity Chairman, Al Leightley, who will collect the checks and turn them over to SVDP. SVDP would then provide written acknowledgement of each individual donation to the donor for purposes of a charity deduction on their tax returns. SVDP would use the checks to support the pantry and other charitable requirements.
- Father Diamond Council would provide SVDP \$20 gift certificate in lieu of a turkey/ham and the traditional \$10 per basket. The council would provide \$20 gift certificates for up to 45 baskets for each holiday. The Council Charity Chairman will coordinate this effort.


