Grand Knight's Message



Brother Knights,

From his own experience as a member of the immigrant community, Fr. Michael J. McGivney saw first hand the devastating effect on families of the untimely death of the father and wage earner.

On March 29, 1882, Fr. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus with a small group of parishioners, while he was an assistant pastor at St. Mary's church in New Haven, Connecticut. The purpose of the group was to strengthen the faith of the men of his parish and to provide financial assistance in the event of their death to the widows and orphans they left behind in the form of fraternal insurance. Insurance companies would not insure Catholics at that time.

Today the Knights of Columbus have over 1.8 million members families and over 15,000 councils world wide. During the Fraternal year of 2012 \$167 million and 70 million man-hours were donated to charity by the order.

Your Council #6292, has nearly 400 Knights. We run >40 activities/year and donate over \$14,000 to charities.

I want to encourage Knights to get involved in the council's activities. I would like to see more Knights at the meetings. Come & see what is going on. Get involved in the charitable programs we are running, come out for family programs and participate., and have some fun.

We are now finishing the month of September and are getting into our very busy months, Keep Christ In Christmas card sales start this month. James Hogan, the chairman of the program, will be reaching out for help. Please, if you have time, volunteer.


Think About it—Bowling League



In Memory—John Hogan, PGK

John F. Hogan, brother of Tom Hogan, PSD, passed away on September 23, 2014 at age 82. John was very active in the early days of Council 6292. He was the 3rd GK (1974-75) and the 17th GK (1988-89). John is a Past Faithful Navigator of Commodore John Barry Assembly in Arlington, and served as a State Council Chairman several times. He was two-time District Deputy in the 1970's. He moved then Providence Council #6292 from St. Ambrose to St Leo the Great parish in 1975. He was

our Council. John also began and operated the St. Leo School bus system at one time. John transferred to Holy Family Council #6831 in Leesburg, where he resided in recent years. John gave much of his time to
