Grand Knight's Message



Dear Brother Knights,

A few weeks ago, one of the readings at mass was from James, Chapter 2, Verses 14-18. It particularly caught my attention because the message, for me, directly related

to all the works that we do, automatically, as members of the Knights of Columbus. The passage reads: "What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith but does not have works? Can that faith save him?

If a brother or sister has nothing to wear and has no food for the day, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, keep warm, and eat well," but you do not give them the necessities of the body, what good is it? So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead."

Until I heard this passage, it never registered with me that just being a Catholic and having faith in Jesus wasn't enough. It's what we do with that faith and how we **spend** our lives, our talents and our energy practicing that faith that is most important. At the very end of Father Aitcheson's homily he said that "God gave us our lives to spend."

We've all been taught that to become wealthy we need to save and invest wisely. However, this only applies to material wealth. To become rich in our faith, to become rich in happiness we need to **spend**. We need to spend our energies and talents in helping our family and neighbors. Being active in the Knights of Columbus is an ideal way for all of us to spend some of our energy improving our community, supporting our parish and school, and becoming more alive in our faith.


September 2015 Family of the Month

Columbus Day Events

There are several events scheduled to celebrate our namesake:

- 1) **Columbus Day Parade**: Saturday, October 10, report time is 8:30am at the Barn (401 West Holly Ave, Sterling, VA) for coffee... shuttle to starting point around 9:30am.
- 2) Columbus Day Celebration at Union Station:

Fourth Degree Exemplification

The next Fourth Degree Exemplification for the Virginia District will be held on Saturday, October 31 at the Westfield's Marriott in Chantilly. This is the first time this Exemplification has been held in Northern Virginia in over two years; there is no telling when it will be held in the north again. Dress for the day is tuxedo (ONLY exceptions: military and first responders may wear dress uniform; clergy may wear clerics); Initiation Fee is \$70 per Candidate, and covers 4th Degree Membership Card and Certificate, Lapel Pin, Social Baldric, and ticket for the Banquet; additional banquet tickets can be purchased for \$57 each. There is a Ladies program that will take place at the same time as the Exemplification... tickets for this are \$30 each. 
